2	relating to immunization requirements.
3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Section 38.001, Education Code, is amended to
5	read as follows:
6	Sec. 38.001. IMMUNIZATION; REQUIREMENTS; EXCEPTIONS. (a)
7	Each student shall be fully immunized against diphtheria, rubeola,
8	rubella, mumps, tetanus, and poliomyelitis, except as provided by
9	Subsection (c).
10	(b) Subject to Subsections (b=1) and (c), the executive
11	commissioner of the Health and Human Services Commission may modify
12	or delete any of the immunizations in Subsection (a) or may require
13	immunizations against additional diseases as a requirement for
14	admission to any elementary or secondary school.
15	(b) Subject to Subsection (c), the Department of State
16	Health Services may modify or delete any of the immunizations in
17	Subsection (a) or may require immunizations against additional
18	diseases as a requirement for admission to any elementary or
19	secondary school. The list in Subsection (a) may only be modified
20	by statute.
21	(b-1) Each year, the Department of State Health Services
22	shall prepare a list of the immunizations required under <del>this</del>
23	section <u>Subsection (a)</u> for admission to public schools and of any
24	additional immunizations the department recommends for school-age

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1 children. The department shall prepare the list in English and 2 Spanish and make the list available in a manner that permits a 3 school district to easily post the list on the district's Internet 4 website as required by Section 38.019.

5 <u>(b-2) No government entity can compel or require an</u> 6 individual to receive a vaccine, not listed in Subsection (a), 7 including but not limited to those listed on the Federal Centers for 8 Disease Control and Preventions Immunization Schedules.

9 (c) Immunization is not required for a person's admission to 10 any elementary or secondary school if the person applying for 11 admission:

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(1) submits to the admitting official:

(A) an affidavit or a certificate signed by a physician who is duly registered and licensed to practice medicine in the United States, in which it is stated that, in the physician's opinion, the immunization required poses a significant risk to the health and well-being of the applicant or any member of the applicant's family or household; or

(B) an affidavit signed by the applicant or, if a minor, by the applicant's parent or guardian stating that the applicant declines immunization for reasons of conscience, including a religious belief; or

(2) is a member of the armed forces of the United24 States and is on active duty.

25 (c-1) An affidavit submitted under Section (c)(1)(B) must 26 be on a form described by Section 161.0041, Health and Safety Code, 27 and must be submitted to the admitting official not later than the

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1 90th day after the date the affidavit is notarized.

2 (d) The Department of State Health Services shall provide 3 the required immunization to children in areas where no local 4 provision exists to provide those services.

6 (e) A person may be provisionally admitted to an elementary 6 or secondary school if the person has begun the required 7 immunizations and if the person continues to receive the necessary 8 immunizations as rapidly as is medically feasible. The Department 9 of State Health Services shall adopt rules relating to the 10 provisional admission of persons to an elementary or secondary 11 school.

12 (f) A person who has not received the immunizations required 13 by this section for reasons of conscience, including because of the 14 person's religious beliefs, may be excluded from school in times of 15 emergency or epidemic declared by the commissioner of public 16 health.

SECTION 2. Sections 81.023, Health and Safety Code, is amended to read as follows:

(a) The <u>executive commissioner may recommend to the</u>
<u>legislature immunizations to include on the list of immunizations</u>
<u>required</u> department shall develop immunization requirements for
children <u>under Education Code Section 38.001(a)</u>.

(b) The department shall cooperate with the Department of Family and Protective Services in formulating and implementing the immunization requirements for children admitted to child-care facilities.

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(c) The department shall cooperate with the State Board of

1 Education in formulating and implementing immunization 2 requirements for students admitted to public or private primary or 3 secondary schools.

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4 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 5 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 6 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 7 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 8 Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
