1	AN ACT
2	relating to an evaluation by the housing and health services
3	coordination council of the 2-1-1 services provided by the Texas
4	Information and Referral Network.
5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Section 2306.1096, Government Code, is amended
7	by adding Subsections (a-1), (a-2), and (b-1) and amending
8	Subsection (b) to read as follows:
9	(a-1) To help inform an expansion of service-enriched
10	housing throughout the state, not later than August 1 of each
11	even-numbered year the council shall complete and submit to the
12	department an evaluation of the 2-1-1 services provided by the
13	Texas Information and Referral Network that considers:
14	(1) data collection from user calls and website visits
15	to determine:
16	(A) the extent of use of 2-1-1 Texas services;
17	(B) demographic characteristics of 2-1-1 Texas
18	users;
19	(C) existing needs of 2-1-1 Texas users;
20	(D) potential marketing needs; and
21	(E) comparisons with similar systems in other
22	states;
23	(2) the database of the Texas Information and Referral
24	Network with respect to:

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1	(A) current integration status of statewide
2	information and state agency resources;
3	(B) current integration status of regional and
4	local information and community resources;
5	(C) the process of identifying new service
6	providers and including those providers in the database;
7	(D) the monitoring of local organizations and
8	state agencies to ensure those entities are providing updated lists
9	of resources to include in the 2-1-1 Texas database; and
10	(E) the ability to timely update
11	emergency-related information into the database;
12	(3) 2-1-1 Texas user interviews and recommendations
13	with respect to a user's point-of-entry experience and satisfaction
14	with any community resource information or referrals resulting from
15	the use of the service, and any other applicable 2-1-1 Texas user
16	recommendations;
17	(4) referral outcome statistics for 2-1-1 Texas users;
18	and
19	(5) 2-1-1 Texas leadership interviews and
20	recommendations with respect to:
21	(A) technology and communication enhancements,
22	including texting and a two-way application programming interface;
23	(B) measures designed to connect specialized
24	populations with available state and local services;
25	(C) practices that support area information
26	centers in any efforts to join with community partners to engage in
27	special projects that leverage the 2-1-1 Texas platform,

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1	technology, and system; and
2	(D) increasing innovation, efficiency, and
3	system integration with state agencies and community partners.
4	(a-2) The Texas Information and Referral Network shall work
5	with the council to determine what de-identified information could
6	be included in the evaluation required under Subsection (a-1) to
7	improve the provision of service-enriched housing.
8	(b) The council shall develop a biennial plan to <u>:</u>
9	(1) implement the goals described by Subsection (a);
10	and
11	(2) improve the delivery of community resource
12	information and referrals by considering the results of the
13	evaluations conducted under Subsection (a-1).
14	(b-1) The department may use funds from general revenue to
15	contract for services on behalf of the council in relation to the
16	council's duties under Subsection (a-1).
17	SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
