- Sec. 1702.333. [PLACE OF RELIGIOUS WORSHIP; 8 CERTAIN
- 9 VOLUNTEERS. (a) In this section, "volunteer security services"
- means services or activities that are: 10
- 11 (1) regulated under this chapter; and
- 12 (2) provided without compensation or remuneration.
- 13 (b) This chapter does not apply to a person who is providing
- volunteer security services on: 14
- 15 (1) the premises of a church, synagogue, or other
- 16 established place of religious worship; or
- (2) premises where an event sponsored or sanctioned by 17
- a public primary or secondary school is taking place. 18
- Except as provided by Subsection (d), while [While] 19 (c)
- providing volunteer security services under Subsection (b), a 20
- person may not wear a uniform or badge that: 21
- 22 contains the word "security"; or (1)
- 23 (2) gives the person the appearance of being a peace
- 24 officer, personal protection officer, or security officer.

- 1 (d) A peace officer providing volunteer security services
- 2 under Subsection (b) may:
- 3 (1) with the consent of the head of the employing or
- 4 appointing law enforcement agency, wear the uniform of the agency;
- 5 <u>or</u>
- 6 (2) wear another uniform or badge that gives the
- 7 person the appearance of being a peace officer.
- 8 <u>(e) The reimbursement for or payment of an insurance policy</u>
- 9 insuring a peace officer who provides volunteer security services
- 10 under Subsection (b) for civil liability arising from acts
- 11 occurring while providing those services is not considered
- 12 <u>compensation or reimbursement.</u>
- 13 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
