A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

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- 2 relating to the licensing of certain veterans by the Texas
- 3 Commission on Law Enforcement and the hiring of those veterans by
- 4 political subdivisions.

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- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. The heading to Chapter 370, Local Government
- 7 Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 8 CHAPTER 370. MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS RELATING TO [MUNICIPAL AND
- 9 COUNTY] HEALTH AND PUBLIC SAFETY OF MORE THAN ONE TYPE OF LOCAL
- 10 GOVERNMENT
- 11 SECTION 2. Chapter 370, Local Government Code, is amended
- 12 by adding Section 370.007 to read as follows:
- 13 Sec. 370.007. APPOINTING OR EMPLOYING CERTAIN VETERANS TO
- 14 POSITION REQUIRING LICENSURE. (a) In this section, "commission"
- 15 means the Texas Commission on Law Enforcement.
- 16 (b) Notwithstanding any other law, a political subdivision
- 17 that appoints or employs a person to hold a position that requires
- 18 the person to be licensed by the commission may appoint or employ a
- 19 legal permanent resident of the United States to hold the position
- 20 if the person is an honorably discharged veteran of the armed forces
- 21 of the United States with at least two years of service before
- 22 discharge and holds the appropriate license issued by the
- 23 commission.
- 24 (c) A political subdivision may not appoint or employ a

- 1 person under this section to hold a supervisory position until the
- 2 person becomes a United States citizen.
- 3 SECTION 3. Subchapter G, Chapter 1701, Occupations Code, is
- 4 amended by adding Section 1701.3095 to read as follows:
- 5 Sec. 1701.3095. LICENSING OF CERTAIN VETERANS WHO ARE LEGAL
- 6 PERMANENT RESIDENTS. The commission shall issue a license the
- 7 commission is authorized to issue to a person who is a legal
- 8 permanent resident of the United States if the person:
- 9 (1) meets the requirements of this chapter and the
- 10 commission's rules for the license;
- 11 (2) is an honorably discharged veteran of the armed
- 12 forces of the United States with at least two years of service
- 13 before discharge; and
- 14 (3) presents evidence satisfactory to the commission
- 15 that the person has applied for United States citizenship.
- SECTION 4. Section 1701.451(a), Occupations Code, is
- 17 amended to read as follows:
- 18 (a) Before a law enforcement agency may hire a person
- 19 licensed under this chapter, the agency must, on a form and in the
- 20 manner prescribed by the commission:
- 21 (1) obtain the person's written consent for the agency
- 22 to review the information required to be reviewed under this
- 23 section;
- 24 (2) request from the commission and any other
- 25 applicable person information required to be reviewed under this
- 26 section; and
- 27 (3) submit to the commission confirmation that the

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- 1 agency, to the best of the agency's ability before hiring the
- 2 person:
- 3 (A) contacted each entity or individual
- 4 necessary to obtain the information required to be reviewed under
- 5 this section; and
- 6 (B) except as provided by Subsection (b),
- 7 obtained and reviewed as related to the person, as applicable:
- 8 (i) personnel files and other employee
- 9 records from each previous law enforcement agency employer,
- 10 including the employment application submitted to the previous
- 11 employer;
- 12 (ii) employment termination reports
- 13 maintained by the commission under this subchapter;
- 14 (iii) service records maintained by the
- 15 commission;
- 16 (iv) proof that the person meets the
- 17 minimum qualifications for enrollment in a training program under
- 18 Section 1701.251(a);
- 19 (v) a military veteran's United States
- 20 Department of Defense Form DD-214 or other military discharge
- 21 record;
- 22 (vi) criminal history record information;
- 23 (vii) information on pending warrants as
- 24 available through the Texas Crime Information Center and National
- 25 Crime Information Center;
- 26 (viii) evidence of financial
- 27 responsibility as required by Section 601.051, Transportation

- 1 Code;
- 2 (ix) a driving record from the Department
- 3 of Public Safety;
- 4 (x) proof of United States citizenship or,
- 5 if the person is an honorably discharged veteran of the armed forces
- 6 of the United States with at least two years of service before
- 7 discharge, proof of legal permanent residence and proof that the
- 8 person has applied for United States citizenship; and
- 9 (xi) information on the person's background
- 10 from at least three personal references and at least two
- 11 professional references.
- 12 SECTION 5. Not later than December 1, 2023, the Texas
- 13 Commission on Law Enforcement shall amend rules as necessary to
- 14 comply with Section 1701.3095, Occupations Code, as added by this
- 15 Act, and Section 1701.451, Occupations Code, as amended by this
- 16 Act.
- 17 SECTION 6. Section 1701.451, Occupations Code, as amended
- 18 by this Act, applies only to the hiring of a person by a law
- 19 enforcement agency that occurs on or after December 1, 2023. The
- 20 hiring of a person by a law enforcement agency that occurs before
- 21 that date is governed by the law in effect immediately before the
- 22 effective date of this Act, and the former law is continued in
- 23 effect for that purpose.
- SECTION 7. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
