## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to county jailer training on interacting with veterans in

- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Subchapter F, Chapter 1701, Occupations Code, is
- 6 amended by adding Section 1701.272 to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 1701.272. TRAINING PROGRAM RELATING TO COUNTY JAILER
- 8 INTERACTIONS WITH VETERANS. The commission shall, in consultation
- 9 with the Texas Veterans Commission, develop a training program for
- 10 county jailers on interacting with veterans in the criminal justice
- 11 system.
- 12 SECTION 2. Section 1701.310(a), Occupations Code, is
- 13 amended to read as follows:
- 14 (a) Except as provided by Subsection (e), a person may not
- 15 be appointed as a county jailer, except on a temporary basis, unless
- 16 the person has satisfactorily completed a preparatory training
- 17 program, as required by the commission, in the operation of a county
- 18 jail at a school operated or licensed by the commission. The
- 19 training program must:
- 20 <u>(1)</u> consist of at least eight hours of mental health
- 21 training approved by the commission and the Commission on Jail
- 22 Standards; and
- 23 (2) include the training program developed under
- 24 Section 1701.272.

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- 1 SECTION 3. (a) The change in law made by this Act applies to
- 2 a county jailer licensed under Chapter 1701, Occupations Code,
- 3 regardless of whether the license was issued before, on, or after
- 4 the effective date of this Act.
- 5 (b) A county jailer who, on the effective date of this Act,
- 6 holds a county jailer license shall complete the training program
- 7 described by Section 1701.272, Occupations Code, as added by this
- 8 Act, not later than August 31, 2025.
- 9 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
