13	a recreational vehicle park or campground consisting of a privately
14	owned parcel or tract of land under the control of a person or
15	entity, other than a governmental entity, on which sites for
16	recreational vehicles, recreational park trailers, or other
17	camping units are offered primarily for transient guest use by
18	members of the public or an organization for overnight stays.
19	Sec. 769.003. MINIMUM STANDARDS. A recreational vehicle
20	park or campground to which this chapter applies must comply with
21	the National Fire Protection Association 1194, Standard for
22	Recreational Vehicle Parks and Campgrounds, other than Section
23	<u>1.1.1.</u>
24	Sec. 769.004. EFFECT OF OTHER LAW. A governmental entity

1 may adopt a policy, rule, ordinance, or order that regulates 2 environmental health and sanitation, electrical distribution 3 system safety, liquefied petroleum gas storage and dispensing 4 safety, or fire protection only if the policy, rule, ordinance, or 5 order does not impose standards more stringent than the standards 6 imposed under Section 769.003. 7 SECTION 2. Notwithstanding Chapter 769, Health and Safety

SECTION 2. Notwithstanding Chapter 769, Health and Safety 8 Code, as added by this Act, a recreational vehicle park or 9 campground to which that chapter applies operating on the effective 10 date of this Act is not required to comply with that chapter before 11 September 1, 2024.
