A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

2 relating to the signature required on a carrier envelope for a 3 ballot voted by mail; changing the elements of a criminal offense.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

5 SECTION 1. Section 86.005(c), Election Code, is amended to 6 read as follows:

7 (c) After marking the ballot, the voter must place it in the 8 official ballot envelope and then seal the ballot envelope, place 9 the ballot envelope in the official carrier envelope and then seal 10 the carrier envelope, and sign the certificate on the carrier 11 envelope <u>using ink on paper</u>. <u>An electronic signature or</u> 12 photocopied signature is not permitted.

13 SECTION 2. Section 86.0051(b), Election Code, is amended to 14 read as follows:

(b) A person other than the voter who assists a voter by depositing the carrier envelope in the mail or with a common or contract carrier or who obtains the carrier envelope for that purpose must provide the person's signature, printed name, and residence address on the reverse side of the envelope. <u>The person</u> <u>must sign the envelope using ink on paper. An electronic signature</u> or photocopied signature is not permitted.
