- 4 SECTION 1. Section 101.106, Civil Practice and Remedies
- 5 Code, is amended by amending Subsections (a) and (e) and adding
- 6 Subsection (g) to read as follows:
- 7 (a) Except as provided by Subsection (g), the [The] filing
- 8 of a suit under this chapter against a governmental unit
- 9 constitutes an irrevocable election by the plaintiff and
- 10 immediately and forever bars any suit or recovery by the plaintiff
- 11 against any individual employee of the governmental unit regarding
- 12 the same subject matter.
- (e) Except as provided by Subsection (g), if [If] a suit is
- 14 filed under this chapter against both a governmental unit and any of
- 15 its employees, the employees shall immediately be dismissed on the
- 16 filing of a motion by the governmental unit.
- 17 (g) This section may not be construed to restrict a
- 18 plaintiff's ability to bring a suit against an employee of a
- 19 governmental unit for assault, battery, false imprisonment, or any
- 20 other intentional tort, including a tort involving disciplinary
- 21 action by school authorities.
- 22 SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies only
- 23 to a cause of action that accrues on or after the effective date of
- 24 this Act. A cause of action that accrued before the effective date

- 1 of this Act is governed by the law applicable to the cause of action
- 2 immediately before the effective date of this Act, and that law is
- 3 continued in effect for that purpose.
- 4 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
