- SECTION 2. Section 28.0211, Education Code, is amended by amending Subsections (a), (a-1), (a-4), (a-5), (f), (f-1), (f-2),
- 12 (f-3), (g), (h), (i), (j), (k), and (n) and adding Subsections
- 13 (a-7), (a-8), (a-9), (a-10), (a-11), (a-12), (a-13), (a-14), (b),
- 14 (b-1), (i-1), (1), (q), and (r) to read as follows:
- 15 (a) To ensure that each student achieves at least
- 16 satisfactory performance on each assessment instrument
- 17 <u>administered under Section 39.023, a [A]</u> school district shall
- 18 <u>ensure that the district's curricular and instructional systems</u>
- 19 provide instruction to all students that:
- (1) is consistently aligned with the essential
- 21 knowledge and skills for the applicable subject area and grade
- 22 <u>level; and</u>

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- 23 (2) strategically and timely addresses deficiencies
- 24 in the prerequisite essential knowledge and skills for the

- 1 applicable subject area and grade level [establish an accelerated
- 2 learning committee described by Subsection (c) for each student who
- 3 does not perform satisfactorily on:
- 4 [(1) the third grade mathematics or reading assessment
- 5 instrument under Section 39.023;
- 6 [(2) the fifth grade mathematics or reading assessment
- 7 instrument under Section 39.023; or
- 8 [(3) the eighth grade mathematics or reading
- 9 assessment instrument under Section 39.023].
- 10 (a-1) Each time a student fails to perform satisfactorily on
- 11 an assessment instrument administered under Section 39.023(a) or
- 12 (1) in the third, fourth, fifth, sixth, seventh, or eighth grade or
- 13 <u>an end-of-course assessment instrument administered under Section</u>
- 14 39.023(c), other than an assessment instrument developed or adopted
- 15 <u>based on alternative academic achievement standards</u>, the school
- 16 district in which the student attends school shall provide to the
- 17 student accelerated instruction in the applicable subject area
- 18 during the subsequent summer or school year and, subject to
- 19 Subsections (a-7) and (a-8), either:

- 2 American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (Pub. L. No. 117-2), then
- 3 supplemental instruction provided by a school district under
- 4 Subsection (a-1)(2) must:
- 5 (1) include targeted instruction in the essential
- 6 knowledge and skills for the applicable grade levels and subject
- 7 area;
- 8 (2) be provided in addition to instruction normally
- 9 provided to students in the grade level in which the student is

- 5 Act, in a state fiscal year, the Texas Education Agency is not
- 6 required to implement a provision found in another section of this
- 7 Act that is drafted as a mandatory provision imposing a duty on the
- 8 agency to take an action unless money is specifically appropriated
- 9 to the agency for that fiscal year to carry out that duty. The Texas
- 10 Education Agency may implement the provision in that fiscal year to
- 11 the extent other funding is available to the agency to do so.
- 12 (b) If, as authorized by Subsection (a) of this section, the
- 13 Texas Education Agency does not implement the mandatory provision
- 14 in a state fiscal year, the agency, in its legislative budget
- 15 request for the next state fiscal biennium, shall certify that fact
- 16 to the Legislative Budget Board and include a written estimate of
- 17 the costs of implementing the provision in each year of that next
- 18 state fiscal biennium.
- 19 (c) This section and the suspension of the Texas Education
- 20 Agency's duty to implement a mandatory provision of this Act, as
- 21 provided by Subsection (a) of this section, expires and the duty to

- 27 Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
