- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 85.025, Family Code, is amended by
- 6 adding Subsection (d) to read as follows:
- 7 (d) As soon as practicable after the release of a person who
- 8 is the subject of a protective order from confinement or
- 9 <u>imprisonment</u>, the <u>Department of Public</u> Safety shall update the
- 10 statewide law enforcement information system maintained by the
- 11 department to reflect the date that the order will expire following
- 12 the person's release.
- SECTION 2. Section 85.026, Family Code, is amended by
- 14 adding Subsection (d) to read as follows:
- 15 (d) Each protective order issued under this subtitle must
- 16 specify when the order expires and must provide notice of any
- 17 extensions that may apply to a person who is the subject of the
- 18 order, as a result of any confinement or imprisonment of that
- 19 person.
- SECTION 3. Section 85.025(d), Family Code, as added by this
- 21 Act, applies only to a protective order with respect to a person who
- 22 is the subject of the order and who is released from confinement or
- 23 imprisonment on or after the effective date of this Act.
- SECTION 4. Section 85.026(d), Family Code, as added by this

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- 1 Act, applies only to a protective order issued on or after the
- 2 effective date of this Act.
- 3 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
