2	relating to sickle cell disease health care improvement and the
3	sickle cell task force.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 533, Government Code, is
6	amended by adding Section 533.0091 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 533.0091. SICKLE CELL DISEASE TREATMENT. (a) To the
8	extent possible, the commission shall:
9	(1) in collaboration with the sickle cell task force
10	established under Chapter 52, Health and Safety Code:
11	(A) ensure that health care services provided
12	under a managed care plan to recipients diagnosed with sickle cell
13	disease align with national clinical practice guidelines and
14	protocols for sickle cell disease treatment; and
15	(B) address sickle cell disease education for
16	Medicaid providers, including emergency room providers; and
17	(2) use the commission's existing data to identify
18	opportunities for improving health outcomes of recipients
19	diagnosed with sickle cell disease by:
20	(A) reducing hospital admissions and
21	readmissions; and
22	(B) connecting those recipients to a sickle cell
23	disease health home or sickle cell disease expert.
24	SECTION 2. Sections 52.0003 and 52.0007, Health and Safety

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1 Code, are amended to read as follows:

2 Sec. 52.0003. COMPOSITION OF TASK FORCE. The task force is 3 composed of the following members appointed by the executive 4 commissioner:

5 (1) two members from community-based organizations 6 with experience addressing the needs of individuals with sickle 7 cell disease;

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(2) two physicians specializing in hematology;

9 (3) two members of the public, each of whom either has 10 sickle cell disease or is a parent of a person with sickle cell 11 disease or trait; [and]

12 (4) one representative of a health-related 13 institution;

14 (5) one representative of the Texas Education Agency;

15 <u>and</u>

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(6) one representative of the commission.

Sec. 52.0007. ANNUAL REPORT. (a) Not later than December 1 of each year, the task force shall prepare and submit to the governor and the legislature an annual written report that summarizes the task force's work and includes any recommended actions or policy changes endorsed by the task force.

22 (b) The task force shall, in collaboration with the 23 commission, include in the task force's annual report 24 recommendations for improving sickle cell disease education for 25 health care providers.

26 SECTION 3. Subtitle B, Title 2, Health and Safety Code, is 27 amended by adding Chapter 52A to read as follows:

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1	CHAPTER 52A. SICKLE CELL DISEASE CARE EDUCATION AND TREATMENT
2	Sec. 52A.001. DEFINITION. In this chapter, "sickle cell
3	task force" means the sickle cell task force established under
4	Chapter 52.
5	Sec. 52A.002. EMERGENCY AND PRIMARY CARE MEDICINE GRADUATE
6	MEDICAL EDUCATION PROGRAM CURRICULUM. (a) In this section,
7	"graduate medical education program" and "medical school" have the
8	meanings assigned by Section 58A.001, Education Code.
9	(b) A medical school in this state that offers an emergency
10	medicine, family medicine, or internal medicine residency program
11	shall examine and incorporate to the extent possible in the
12	curriculum requirements for the program education focused on sickle
13	cell disease and sickle cell trait. The medical school may enter
14	into agreements as necessary for the purposes of this section.
15	Sec. 52A.005. INFORMATION FOR PUBLIC SCHOOL DISTRICT
16	PERSONNEL. (a) To the extent possible, the Texas Education Agency
17	shall collaborate with sickle cell disease community-based
18	organizations to provide information on sickle cell disease and
19	sickle cell trait to public school districts and district staff,
20	including school nurses, teachers, and coaches.
21	(b) The commission in collaboration with the sickle cell
22	task force shall explore methods for improving sickle cell disease
23	education and awareness within the public school system and provide
24	recommendations to the Texas Education Agency on the improvement

25 methods.

26 SECTION 4. As soon as practicable after the effective date 27 of this Act, the executive commissioner of the Health and Human

H.B. No. 1488 1 Services Commission shall appoint the new members of the sickle 2 cell task force as required by Section 52.0003, Health and Safety 3 Code, as amended by this Act.

4 SECTION 5. Section 52A.004, Health and Safety Code, as 5 added by this Act, applies to residents entering an emergency 6 medicine, family medicine, or internal residency program at a 7 medical school in this state on or after January 1, 2024.

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SECTION 6. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
