- or sex, is inherently racist, sexist, or oppressive, whether 15

- SECTION 2. Section 51.982, Education Code, as added by this
- 14 Act, applies beginning with the 2023-2024 academic year.
- SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 16 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 17 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 18 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 19 Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
