## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

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1	AN ACT
2	relating to the expansion of eligibility for Medicaid to certain
3	individuals diagnosed with certain mental health disorders for whom
4	federal matching money is available.
5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 32, Human Resources Code,
7	is amended by adding Section 32.02473 to read as follows:
8	Sec. 32.02473. EXPANDED ELIGIBILITY FOR MEDICAL
9	ASSISTANCE. (a) Notwithstanding any other law, the commission
10	shall provide medical assistance to all individuals:
11	(1) who are diagnosed with bipolar disorder,
12	dysthymia, schizophrenia, or severe chronic depression;
13	(2) who have a family income that does not exceed 133
14	percent of the applicable federal poverty level;
15	(3) who apply for the assistance; and
16	(4) for whom federal matching money is available.
17	(b) The executive commissioner shall adopt rules necessary
18	to implement this section.
19	SECTION 2. Section 32.02473, Human Resources Code, as added

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by this Act, applies only to an initial determination or

recertification of eligibility of an individual for medical

assistance under Chapter 32, Human Resources Code, made on or after

the date the section is implemented, regardless of the date the

individual applied for that assistance.

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- 1 SECTION 3. As soon as possible after the effective date of
- 2 this Act, the executive commissioner of the Health and Human
- 3 Services Commission shall take all necessary actions to expand
- 4 eligibility for medical assistance under Chapter 32, Human
- 5 Resources Code, in accordance with Section 32.02473, Human
- 6 Resources Code, as added by this Act, including notifying
- 7 appropriate federal agencies of that expanded eligibility.
- 8 SECTION 4. If before implementing any provision of this Act
- 9 a state agency determines that any other waiver or authorization
- 10 from a federal agency is necessary for implementation of that
- 11 provision, the agency affected by the provision shall request the
- 12 waiver or authorization and may delay implementing that provision
- 13 until the waiver or authorization is granted.
- SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
