2	relating to exemptions granted by the Parks and Wildlife Commission
3	to persons with disabilities; creating a criminal offense.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 11, Parks and Wildlife
6	Code, is amended by adding Section 11.006 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 11.006. EXEMPTIONS FOR PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES. (a)
8	This section applies only to:
9	(1) an activity regulated by the department that
10	includes the authorized taking of fish, wildlife, or other
11	resources; and
12	(2) a requirement or prohibition imposed by this code
13	or commission rule that relates to:
14	(A) the manner of the taking of fish, wildlife,
15	or other resources authorized under an activity described by
16	Subdivision (1); or
17	(B) the equipment used to take the fish,
18	wildlife, or other resources or to otherwise participate in the
19	activity.
20	(b) The commission by rule may grant a person with a
21	disability an exemption from a requirement or prohibition described
22	by Subsection (a)(2) if the requirement or prohibition restricts or
23	prevents the person from substantially participating in an activity
24	described by Subsection (a)(1).

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H.B. No. 1643 (c) The commission by rule shall establish procedures and 1 criteria for granting an exemption under Subsection (b). Rules 2 adopted under this subsection must provide that an application for 3 an exemption under Subsection (b) must be: 4 5 (1) on a form prescribed by the commission; and 6 (2) accompanied by a notarized written statement or 7 written prescription of a physician licensed to practice medicine 8 in this state certifying that the person making the application has a disability that restricts or prevents the person's ability to 9 substantially participate in an activity described by Subsection 10 (a)(1) while complying with a requirement or prohibition described 11 12 by Subsection (a)(2). (d) An exemption granted under this section: 13 14 (1) may not change the fundamental nature of the 15 activity for which the person seeks the exemption; 16 (2) is valid for one year; and 17 (3) may be renewed in the manner prescribed by 18 commission rule. 19 (e) The department shall issue to a person granted an exemption under this section a document demonstrating proof of the 20 21 exemption. (f) A person granted an exemption under this section must 22 have the document issued by the department under Subsection (e) in 23 24 the person's immediate possession at all times while participating in the activity for which the exemption is granted. 25 26 (g) A person who violates Subsection (f) commits an offense that is a Class C Parks and Wildlife Code misdemeanor. It is a 27

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1	defense to prosecution under this subsection that the person
2	charged produces in court the document issued by the department
3	under Subsection (e) that was valid on the date of the alleged
4	offense.
5	(h) Not later than December 1 of each even-numbered year,
6	the department shall prepare and submit to the standing committee
7	of each house of the legislature with primary jurisdiction over the
8	department a report of the exemption requests received by the
9	department in the reporting period, including an anonymized
10	description of each request and whether an exemption had been
11	granted or denied for the request.
12	SECTION 2. As soon as practicable after the effective date
13	of this Act, the Parks and Wildlife Commission shall adopt rules as
14	necessary to implement and administer Section 11.006, Parks and
15	Wildlife Code, as added by this Act.

16 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
