## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the reimbursement under Medicaid of local educational
3	agencies for the provision of health care services to students.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 32, Human Resources Code,
6	is amended by adding Section 32.0271 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 32.0271. REIMBURSEMENT FOR CERTAIN SERVICES PROVIDED
8	TO MEDICAID-ELIGIBLE STUDENTS BY LOCAL EDUCATIONAL AGENCIES. (a)
9	In this section, "local educational agency" includes a school
10	district or open-enrollment charter school.
11	(b) The commission shall ensure that Medicaid reimbursement
12	is provided to a local educational agency for all health care
13	services covered under Medicaid, including behavioral health
14	services, that are provided to students eligible for Medicaid
15	through the agency by a health professional, if:
16	(1) the agency is an authorized health care provider
17	under Medicaid; and
18	(2) the parent or legal guardian of the student
19	provides consent before the service is provided.
20	(c) To the extent permitted by federal law, the commission
21	shall ensure a local educational agency receives Medicaid
22	reimbursement under Subsection (b):
23	(1) regardless of whether:
2/1	(A) there is any charge for the service to the

- 1 student as a Medicaid recipient or to the community at large;
- 2 (B) the service is included in a student's
- 3 <u>individualized education plan or individualized family service</u>
- 4 plan; and
- 5 (C) the health professional providing the
- 6 service is the recipient's primary care provider; and
- 7 (2) that is based on the random moment time study
- 8 methodology.
- 9 (d) A local educational agency may only use the proceeds of
- 10 Medicaid reimbursements received under this section to continue to
- 11 fund the provision of health care services by the agency.
- 12 SECTION 2. As soon as practicable after the effective date
- 13 of this Act, the Health and Human Services Commission shall seek an
- 14 amendment to the state Medicaid plan or other appropriate
- 15 authorization from the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services
- 16 or other appropriate federal agency necessary to implement Section
- 17 32.0271, Human Resources Code, as added by this Act, and may delay
- 18 implementing that section until the amendment or other
- 19 authorization is granted.
- 20 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 21 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 22 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 23 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 24 Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
