5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Subtitle D, Title 2, Health and Safety Code, is
7	amended by adding Chapter 83A to read as follows:
8	CHAPTER 83A. RITA LITTLEFIELD CHRONIC KIDNEY DISEASE CENTRALIZED
9	RESOURCE CENTER
10	Sec. 83A.001. DEFINITION. In this chapter, "resource
11	center" means the Rita Littlefield Chronic Kidney Disease
12	Centralized Resource Center established under this chapter.
13	Sec. 83A.002. ESTABLISHMENT OF RESOURCE CENTER. The Rita
14	Littlefield Chronic Kidney Disease Centralized Resource Center is
15	established within the commission to serve as a centralized system
16	through which persons may:
17	(1) request and obtain information on chronic kidney
18	disease and related illnesses, including each clinical stage of
19	kidney disease and end stage renal disease; and
20	(2) register for inclusion in a kidney health clinical
21	trials registry to receive information on clinical trials and
22	clinical trial opportunities for chronic kidney disease and related
23	illnesses.
24	Sec. 83A.003. ADMINISTRATION OF RESOURCE CENTER. (a) The

1	commission shall administer the resource center in accordance with
2	this chapter.
3	(b) The commission shall:
4	(1) structure and operate the resource center in a
5	manner that provides a comprehensive approach for readily accessing
6	information on and resources for chronic kidney disease and related
7	illnesses, including for each clinical stage of kidney disease and
8	end stage renal disease; and
9	(2) establish, and the resource center shall maintain,
10	a kidney health clinical trials registry through which patients and
11	family members of those patients may register to receive
12	educational information on clinical trials and clinical trial
13	opportunities based on the clinical stage of a patient's chronic
14	kidney disease or end stage renal disease.
15	(c) The comprehensive approach described by Subsection
16	(b)(1) must allow individuals to request and obtain or to directly
17	access aggregated information on:
18	(1) chronic kidney disease awareness, prevention, and
19	professional education opportunities, including:
20	(A) awareness campaigns for chronic kidney
21	disease and related illnesses;
22	(B) information on accessing free screenings for
23	chronic kidney disease and related illnesses;
24	(C) professional resources and continuing
25	education opportunities for health care providers who treat
26	patients with chronic kidney disease or related illnesses;
27	(D) for individuals who register for inclusion in

1	the clinical trials registry established under Subsection (b)(2),
2	information on clinical trials and clinical trial opportunities for
3	chronic kidney disease and related illnesses; and
4	(E) information on chronic kidney disease
5	partners, including chronic kidney disease patient advocates,
6	dialysis professionals, health care providers, researchers,
7	manufacturers, and other appropriate persons;
8	(2) patient and family resources, including:
9	(A) educational resources containing general and
10	specific chronic kidney disease information;
11	(B) resources containing information on chronic
12	kidney disease prevention and early detection of chronic kidney
13	disease and related illnesses;
14	(C) nutritional and metabolism information for
15	individuals with chronic kidney disease and related illnesses;
16	(D) resources appropriately tailored to provide
17	information on chronic kidney disease and related illnesses to
18	individuals within groups that experience health disparities,
19	including racial minorities;
20	(E) directories for physicians who specialize in
21	kidney health; and
22	(F) programs through which an individual may
23	obtain a kidney donation or be placed on a kidney donation list; and
24	(3) resources on chronic kidney disease treatment
25	options and modalities, including:
26	(A) kidney donations and kidney transplantation
27	<u>initiatives;</u>

1	(B) deceased and living organ donation programs
2	and initiatives;
3	(C) organ recipient registries;
4	(D) treatment options for chronic kidney disease
5	and end stage renal disease;
6	(E) financial assistance for obtaining treatment
7	for chronic kidney disease or related illnesses; and
8	(F) options for receiving treatment for chronic
9	kidney disease or related illnesses through the use of telehealth
10	service or telemedicine medical service, as those terms are defined
11	by Section 111.001, Occupations Code.
12	(d) The commission shall ensure information provided by the
13	resource center is available in both English and Spanish.
14	Sec. 83A.004. INTERNET WEBSITE. In collaboration with the
15	Chronic Kidney Disease Task Force established under Chapter 83, the
16	commission shall establish and the resource center shall maintain
17	an Internet website through which:
18	(1) resource center employees and members of the
19	public may directly communicate and exchange information on chronic
20	kidney disease and related illnesses; and
21	(2) individuals may register in the clinical trials
22	registry established under Section 83A.003(b)(2).
23	Sec. 83A.005. GIFTS, GRANTS, AND DONATIONS. The commission
24	may solicit and accept gifts, grants, and donations from any source
25	to implement this chapter.
26	SECTION 2. The Health and Human Services Commission is
27	required to implement a provision of this Act only if the

legislature appropriates money specifically for that purpose. If the legislature does not appropriate money specifically for that purpose, the commission may, but is not required to, implement a provision of this Act using other appropriations available for that purpose.

6 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
