A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the authority of the Texas Transportation Commission to
3	establish variable speed limits.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Section 545.353, Transportation Code, is amended
6	by adding Subsection (k) to read as follows:
7	(k) The commission by rule may establish a variable speed
8	limit program to allow the temporary lowering of a prima facie speed
9	limit to address inclement weather, congestion, road construction,
10	or any other condition that affects the safe and orderly movement of
11	traffic on a roadway for which the commission has the authority to
12	establish a speed limit. Notice of a speed limit established under
13	the program may be displayed using a stationary or portable
14	changeable message sign, as defined by Section 544.013. The
15	program may not authorize the lowering of a speed limit to divert
16	traffic to a toll road for the purpose of increasing revenue from
17	toll charges. A speed limit that is established under the program:
18	(1) must be based on an engineering and traffic
19	<pre>investigation;</pre>
20	(2) may be effective for all or a designated portion of
21	the highway and may be effective for any period of the day or night,
22	as the Texas Department of Transportation determines necessary;
23	(3) may not be less than 10 miles per hour below the
24	prima facie speed limit on the portion of the highway to which it

- 1 applies; and
- 2 (4) is effective only when the speed limit is posted
- 3 and only if a sign notifying motorists of the change in speed limit
- 4 <u>is posted not less than 500 feet but not more than 1,000 feet before</u>
- 5 the point at which the speed limit begins.
- 6 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 7 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 8 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 9 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 10 Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
