H.B. No. 1929

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

2 relating to the adoption of rules concerning certain on-site sewage
3 disposal systems.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

5 SECTION 1. Section 366.012(a), Health and Safety Code, is
6 amended to read as follows:

7 (a) To assure the effective and efficient administration of
8 this chapter, the commission shall:

9 (1) adopt rules governing the installation of on-site
10 sewage disposal systems, including rules concerning the:

11 (A) review and approval of on-site sewage
12 disposal systems; and

13 (B) temporary waiver of a permit for an emergency
14 repair; and

15 (2) adopt rules under this chapter that:

16 (A) encourage the use of economically feasible
17 alternative techniques and technologies for on-site sewage
18 disposal systems that can be used in soils not suitable for
19 conventional on-site sewage disposal;

20 (B) address the separation of graywater, as
21 defined by Section 341.039, in a residence served by an on-site
22 sewage disposal system;

23 (C) allow for an adjustment in the size required
24 of an on-site sewage disposal system if the system is used in

1 conjunction with a graywater system that complies with the rules
2 adopted under Section 341.039; ~~and~~

3 (D) require on-site sewage disposal systems,
4 including risers and covers, installed after September 1, 2012, to
5 be designed to prevent access to the system by anyone other than:

6 (i) the owner of the system; or

7 (ii) a person described by Section
8 366.071(a) or (b); and

9 (E) for a county with a population of at least
10 350,000 and not more than 370,000 that is adjacent to the Gulf of
11 Mexico and adjacent to a county with a population of at least 3.3
12 million, allow for the installation of aerobic drip emitter systems
13 on subdivided or platted properties less than one-half acre in size
14 serving single-family residences supplied by a public drinking
15 water system if site-specific planning materials have been:

16 (i) submitted by a licensed engineer or
17 registered sanitarian; and

18 (ii) approved by the appropriate authorized
19 agent.

20 SECTION 2. As soon as practicable after the effective date
21 of this Act, the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality shall
22 adopt rules in accordance with Section 366.012(a), Health and
23 Safety Code, as amended by this Act.

24 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
