A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to a study regarding establishing a public law school as a professional school of The University of Texas at El Paso. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 SECTION 1. FEASIBILITY STUDY. (a) 5 The president of The University of Texas at El Paso shall designate a department or 6 entity at the university to conduct a study to examine the need for 7 and feasibility of establishing a school of law as a professional 8 school of The University of Texas at El Paso. The department or 9 entity may seek the assistance of outside experts or consultants, 10 11 as necessary. 12 (b) The study must: 13 (1) assess the need for establishing an institution 14 described by Subsection (a) of this section; (2) include a financial plan for establishing an

(2) include a financial plan for establishing an
institution described by Subsection (a) of this section, including
the cost associated with establishing the institution; and

(3) examine the feasibility of establishing an
institution described by Subsection (a) of this section, including
the projected timeline for accreditation of the institution.

21 SECTION 2. REPORT. (a) The department or entity at The 22 University of Texas at El Paso designated to conduct the study under 23 Section 1 of this Act shall prepare a written report summarizing the 24 results of the study. The report must also:

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(1) identify the challenges related to establishing a
 2 school of law as a professional school of The University of Texas at
 3 El Paso;

4 (2) include recommendations for legislative or other 5 action; and

6 (3) include any other matter the department or entity7 considers appropriate.

8 (b) Not later than September 1, 2024, the department or 9 entity described by Subsection (a) of this section shall submit the 10 report to the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board.

11 SECTION 3. FUNDING. The department or entity at The 12 University of Texas at El Paso designated to conduct the study under 13 Section 1 of this Act may use money appropriated by the legislature 14 or otherwise available for the purpose to pay for any costs 15 associated with conducting the study and with preparing the report 16 required by Section 2 of this Act.

SECTION 4. EXPIRATION. This Act expires December 1, 2024.
 SECTION 5. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act takes effect September
 1, 2023.

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
