8 CERTAIN ACTIONS. (a) If a court determines that an order,

9 ordinance, regulatory decision, denial of an application, refusal

10 to issue a permit, or similar measure of a political subdivision is

11 unenforceable because it is preempted by the Texas Constitution or

12 <u>a statute of this state</u>, the court shall award the person prevailing

13 <u>in the action on that basis court costs and reasonable attorney's</u>

14 fees, including expert witness fees, to be paid by the political

15 subdivision.

16 (b) If a court determines that an officer of a political

17 subdivision has failed to perform an act of the office required by

18 the Texas Constitution or a statute of this state, the court shall

19 award the person prevailing in the action challenging the officer

20 for failure to perform that act court costs and reasonable

21 attorney's fees, including expert witness fees, to be paid by the

22 political subdivision for which the officer served at the time of

23 the failure to perform the act.

- 2 shall award the person prevailing in the action court costs and

- 5 SECTION 2. Section 250.014, Local Government Code, as added
- 6 by this Act, applies only to an action commenced on or after the
- 7 effective date of this Act.
- 8 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
