## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

## AN ACT

2 relating to eligibility to receive certain federal funding for 3 postsecondary career and technology education distributed by the 4 Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
SECTION 1. Subchapter C, Chapter 61, Education Code, is
amended by adding Section 61.0761 to read as follows:

Sec. 61.0761. CAREER AND TECHNOLOGY EDUCATION GRANTS. (a) 8 In this section, "ability to benefit career and technology 9 education program" means a postsecondary career and technology 10 education program in which a person who does not have a high school 11 12 diploma or equivalency certificate and who both qualifies for federal student financial aid and demonstrates on an assessment 13 14 instrument that the person can pass college-level courses with some support may enroll. 15

16 (b) In establishing criteria for postsecondary career and 17 technology education funding provided under the Carl D. Perkins 18 Vocational and Technical Education Act of 1998 (20 U.S.C. Section 19 2301 et seq.), the board shall, to the extent permitted under that 20 law, ensure that noncredit and ability to benefit career and 21 technology education programs are eligible to receive funding.
