5	SECTION 1. Section 1001.201, Health and Safety Code, is
6	amended to read as follows:
7	Sec. 1001.201. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter:
8	(1) "Child-care facility" has the meaning assigned by
9	Section 42.002, Human Resources Code.
10	(2) "Educator" means a person who is required to hold a
11	certificate issued under Subchapter B, Chapter 21, Education Code.
12	(3) "First responder" has the meaning assigned by
13	Section 421.095, Government Code.
14	(4) "Institution of higher education" has the meaning
15	assigned by Section 61.003, Education Code.
16	(5) "Local behavioral health authority" means an
17	authority designated by the commission under Section 533.0356.
18	(6) [ <del>(2)</del> ] "Local mental health authority" has the
19	meaning assigned by Section 531.002.
20	(7) "Open-enrollment charter school" and "private
21	school" have the meanings assigned by Section 5.001, Education
22	<u>Code.</u>
23	(8) [ <del>(3)</del> ] "Regional education service center" means a
24	regional education service center established under Chapter 8,

2 (9) [(4)] "School district employee" means a person 3 employed by a school district who regularly interacts with students 4 through the course of the person's duties, including an educator, a 5 secretary, a school bus driver, or a cafeteria worker.

6 (10) [(5)] "School resource officer" has the meaning
7 assigned by Section 1701.601, Occupations Code.

8 [(6) "University employee" means a person employed by 9 a public or private institution of higher education who regularly 10 interacts with students enrolled at the university through the 11 course of the person's duties.]

SECTION 2. Section 1001.202, Health and Safety Code, is amended to read as follows:

Sec. 1001.202. GRANTS FOR TRAINING OF MENTAL HEALTH FIRST AID TRAINERS. (a) To the extent <u>money is</u> [funds are] appropriated to the <u>commission</u> [department] for that purpose, the <u>commission</u> [department] shall make grants to local mental health authorities or local behavioral health authorities to contract with persons approved by the <u>commission</u> [department] to train employees or contractors of the authorities as mental health first aid trainers.

(b) The <u>commission</u> [department] shall make each grant to a local mental health authority <u>or local behavioral health authority</u> under this section in <u>the</u> [an] amount <u>the commission determines</u> <u>necessary to cover the costs of training</u> [equal to \$1,000 times the <u>number of</u>] employees or contractors of the authority whose training as mental health first aid trainers will be paid by the grant.

27 (d) The executive commissioner shall adopt rules to

1 establish the requirements for a person to be approved by the 2 <u>commission</u> [department] to train employees or contractors of a 3 local mental health authority <u>or local behavioral health authority</u> 4 as mental health first aid trainers. The rules must ensure that a 5 person who is approved by the <u>commission</u> [department] is qualified 6 to provide training in:

7 (1) the potential risk factors and warning signs for
8 various mental illnesses, including depression, anxiety, trauma,
9 psychosis, eating disorders, substance <u>use</u> [abuse] disorders, and
10 self-injury;

11 (2) the prevalence of various mental illnesses in the 12 United States and the need to reduce the stigma associated with 13 mental illness;

14 (3) an action plan for use by the employees or 15 contractors that involves the use of skills, resources, and 16 knowledge to assess a situation and develop and implement an 17 appropriate intervention to help an individual experiencing a 18 mental health crisis obtain appropriate professional care; and

19 (4) the evidence-based professional, peer, social, 20 and self-help resources available to help individuals with mental 21 illness.

(e) Two or more local mental health authorities <u>or local</u>
 <u>behavioral health authorities</u> may collaborate and share resources
 to provide training for employees or contractors of the authorities
 under this section.

26 SECTION 3. Section 1001.203, Health and Safety Code, is 27 amended to read as follows:

1 Sec. 1001.203. GRANTS FOR TRAINING CERTAIN INDIVIDUALS [UNIVERSITY EMPLOYEES, SCHOOL DISTRICT EMPLOYEES, AND SCHOOL 2 **RESOURCE OFFICERS**] IN MENTAL HEALTH FIRST AID. (a) To the extent 3 money is [funds are] appropriated [to the department] for the 4 5 [that] purpose, the commission [department] shall make grants to local mental health authorities or local behavioral health 6 authorities to provide at no cost an approved mental health first 7 8 aid training program  $[\tau]$  administered by mental health first aid trainers[, at no cost] to the following individuals at the 9 discretion of the authorities: 10 (1) [university employees,] 11 school district employees  $[\tau]$  and school resource officers; 12 13 (2) employees of: 14 (A) an institution of higher education; 15 (B) an open-enrollment charter school; or (C) a private school; 16 17 (3) employees and contractors of a child-care 18 facility; 19 (4) youth; (5) individuals with direct and recurring contact with 20 students; 21 (6) first responders; 22 military service members, veterans, or immediate 23 (7) 24 family members of military service members or veterans; 25 (8) judges and attorneys, as applicable based on the 26 practice of law of the judge or attorney; or 27 (9) contractors of an institution of higher education,

3 (c) The <u>commission</u> [department] shall grant [\$100] to a 4 local mental health authority <u>or local behavioral health authority</u> 5 <u>the amount the commission determines necessary to cover the costs</u> 6 <u>of training each individual described by Subsection (a)</u> [for each 7 <u>university employee, school district employee, or school resource</u> 8 <u>officer</u>] who successfully completes a mental health first aid 9 training program provided by the authority under this section.

10 (d) A mental health first aid training program provided by a 11 local mental health authority <u>or local behavioral health authority</u> 12 under this section must:

13 (1) be conducted by a person trained as a mental health14 first aid trainer;

(2) provide participants with the skills necessary to
help an individual experiencing a mental health crisis until the
individual is able to obtain appropriate professional care; and

(A) instruction in a five-step strategy for
helping an individual experiencing a mental health crisis,
including assessing risk, listening respectfully to and supporting
the individual, and identifying professional help and other
supports for the individual;

(B) an introduction to the risk factors and warning signs for mental illness and substance <u>use</u> [abuse] problems;

3 (D) a presentation of evidence-supported4 treatment and self-help strategies.

5 (e) A local mental health authority or local behavioral health authority may contract with a regional education service 6 center to provide under this section a mental health first aid 7 8 training program to [university employees,] school district employees and contractors, [and] school resource 9 officers, open-enrollment charter school employees and contractors, private 10 school employees and contractors, and employees and contractors of 11 12 an institution of higher education [under this section].

13 (f) Two or more local mental health authorities <u>or local</u> 14 <u>behavioral health authorities</u> may collaborate and share resources 15 to develop and operate a mental health first aid training program 16 under this section.

SECTION 4. Section 1001.204, Health and Safety Code, is amended to read as follows:

Sec. 1001.204. PLANS FOR MENTAL HEALTH FIRST AID TRAINING 19 PROGRAMS. (a) Not later than July 1 of each even-numbered [state 20 fiscal] year for which a local mental health authority or local 21 behavioral health authority will seek a grant from the commission 22 [department] under Section 1001.203, the authority shall submit to 23 24 the commission [department] a plan demonstrating the manner in which grants made to the authority under that section will be used: 25 (1) to train individuals in mental health first aid 26 throughout the authority's local service area to maximize the 27

1 number of children who have direct contact with an individual who 2 has successfully completed a mental health first aid training 3 program provided by the authority;

4 (2) to meet the greatest needs of the authority's local
5 service area, as identified by the authority; and

6 (3) to complement existing resources and not duplicate7 established mental health first aid training efforts.

8 (b) The <u>commission</u> [department] may not make a grant to a 9 local mental health authority <u>or local behavioral health authority</u> 10 under Section 1001.203 unless the <u>commission</u> [department] has 11 evaluated a plan submitted by the authority under this section.

SECTION 5. Section 1001.205, Health and Safety Code, is amended to read as follows:

Sec. 1001.205. REPORTS. (a) Not later than September 30 of each year, a local mental health authority <u>or local behavioral</u> <u>health authority</u> shall provide to the <u>commission</u> [<del>department</del>] the number of:

(1) employees and contractors of the authority who were trained as mental health first aid trainers under Section 1001.202 during the preceding fiscal year, the number of trainers who left the program for any reason during the preceding fiscal year, and the number of active trainers;

[university employees,] 23 (2) school district 24  $employees[_{\tau}]$ and contractors, school resource officers, open-enrollment charter school employees and contractors, private 25 26 school employees and contractors, and employees and contractors of an institution of higher education who completed a mental health 27

(b) Not later than December 1 of each year, the <u>commission</u> [department] shall compile the information submitted by local mental health authorities <u>or local behavioral health authorities</u> as required by Subsection (a) and submit a report to the legislature

2 (1) the number of authority employees and contractors 3 trained as mental health first aid trainers during the preceding 4 fiscal year, the number of trainers who left the program for any 5 reason during the preceding fiscal year, and the number of active 6 trainers;

1 (4) <u>the number of military service members</u>, veterans, 2 and immediate family members of <u>military service members and</u> 3 veterans who completed the veterans module <u>or standard version</u> of a 4 mental health first aid training program provided by an authority 5 during the preceding fiscal year <u>categorized by local mental health</u> 6 <u>authority or local behavioral health authority region and the</u> 7 training program completed; and

8 (5) a detailed accounting of expenditures of money 9 appropriated for the purpose of implementing this subchapter.

10 (c) The <u>commission</u> [department] shall develop and provide 11 to local mental health authorities <u>and local behavioral health</u> 12 <u>authorities</u> a form to be used for the reporting of information 13 required under Subsection (a), including the reporting of each 14 category of personnel described by that subsection.

15 SECTION 6. Section 1001.206, Health and Safety Code, is 16 amended to read as follows:

Sec. 1001.206. LIABILITY. A person who has completed a mental health first aid training program offered by a local mental health authority <u>or local behavioral health authority</u> under this subchapter and who in good faith attempts to assist an individual experiencing a mental health crisis is not liable in civil damages for an act performed in attempting to assist the individual unless the act is wilfully or wantonly negligent.
