2	relating to minimum standards for entry safety point protocols and
3	infrastructure for school districts and charter schools.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter G, Chapter 37, Education Code, is
6	amended by adding Section 37.2072 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 37.2072. MINIMUM STANDARDS FOR SCHOOL ENTRY POINT
8	PROTOCOLS AND INFRASTRUCTURE. (a) The center shall develop
9	minimum standards for reducing and securing school entry points in
10	order to ensure that the security standards for instructional
11	facilities and other school district and charter school facilities
12	provide for a safe environment.
13	(b) The minimum standards for reducing entry points
14	developed pursuant to Subsection (a) shall include:
15	(1) determining the minimum number of open entry
16	points required to allow for efficient ingress of students and
17	faculty for the start of a school day and limiting the number of
18	open entry points to that minimum;
19	(2) further reducing the total number of open entry
20	points to the greatest extent possible once the initial entry of
21	students and faculty for the start of a school day has been
22	<pre>completed;</pre>
23	(3) securing all other points of access so as to not
24	allow entry while still allowing students and faculty to exit in the

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1 event of an emergency; and 2 (4) remotely monitoring other points of access by use 3 of access controls, camera systems, or other devices determined by the school district or charter school to be effective and feasible. 4 5 (c) The minimum standards for securing entry points developed pursuant to Subsection (a) shall be divided into four 6 7 levels based upon the specific needs and available resources of a school district or charter school. The levels shall be delineated 8 as follows: 9 10 (1) Level One shall provide for visual surveillance of the entry point by school security personnel or school staff to 11 12 monitor for unusual behavior while applying questioning, individual searches, and bag checks when deemed warranted; 13 (2) Level Two shall include all of the practices 14 15 described in Level One, as well as performing random checks of entrants by school security personnel or school staff utilizing 16 17 handheld metal detectors; (3) Level Three shall include establishing security 18 19 screening during which entrants and their belongings would be randomly screened by walk through metal detectors, as well as 20 applying all of the practices described in Level One and using 21 22 handheld metal detectors for secondary screening; and (4) Level Four shall entail comprehensive security 23 24 screening of all entrants and their belongings, including applying all of the practices described in Level One; screening all entrants 25 26 through the use of walk through metal detectors; using handheld metal detectors for secondary screening; conducting bag checks in 27

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1	only	those	instances	in	which	the	alarm	in	the	walk	through	metal

- 2 detector sounds; and instructing entrants to use low metal content
- 3 backpacks and school supplies to mitigate the alarms and maintain
- 4 <u>efficient ingress.</u>
- 5 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
