5	SECTION 1. Section 483.001(11), Health and Safety Code, is

- SECTION 3. Subchapter B, Chapter 562, Occupations Code, is
- 14 amended by adding Section 562.058 to read as follows:
- 15 Sec. 562.058. ORDERING AND FURNISHING CERTAIN PRESCRIPTION
- 16 DRUGS. (a) In this section:
- 17 (1) "Acute condition" means a condition or disease
- 18 that begins abruptly, intensifies rapidly, and is generally not
- 19 long-lasting.
- 20 (2) "Waived clinical laboratory test" means a clinical
- 21 <u>laboratory test that is classified as waived under federal</u>
- 22 <u>regulations issued under the Clinical Laboratory Improvement</u>
- 23 Amendments of 1988 (42 U.S.C. Section 263a).
- (b) Notwithstanding any other law, a pharmacist may order
- 25 and furnish to a patient a prescription drug to treat an acute
- 26 condition that is identified through performance of one of the
- 27 following tests, if the test is a waived clinical laboratory test:

- 1 (1) a rapid strep test or rapid antigen detection test
- 2 used in the identification of group A streptococcus (GAS);
- 3 (2) a rapid influenza diagnostic test used in the
- 4 identification of influenza types A and B; or
- 5 (3) a rapid diagnostic test for SARS-CoV-2 or a
- 6 related virus used in the identification of COVID-19 or a related
- 7 <u>illness.</u>
- 8 (c) The board shall adopt rules to permit a pharmacist to
- 9 order and furnish a prescription drug under this section to a
- 10 patient without an established physician-patient relationship.
- 11 (d) A pharmacist who orders and furnishes a prescription
- 12 drug under this section must provide notice to the patient's
- 13 primary care physician, as identified by the patient if the patient
- 14 has a primary care physician, not later than the 14th day after the
- 15 date the drug is ordered and furnished by the pharmacist.
- 16 (e) The board by rule shall establish requirements to ensure
- 17 that a pharmacist possesses the necessary skill and training to
- 18 order and furnish prescription drugs under this section.
- 19 SECTION 4. Not later than January 1, 2024, the Texas State
- 20 Board of Pharmacy shall adopt the rules required under Section
- 21 562.058, Occupations Code, as added by this Act.
- 22 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
