A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to the regulation of the practice of pharmacy.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. Section 562.0541(d), Occupations Code, is
- 5 amended to read as follows:
- 6 (d) The quantity of an emergency refill of insulin may not
- 7 exceed a 30-day supply unless the smallest commercially available
- 8 package exceeds a 30-day supply. A pharmacist may dispense
- 9 multiple packages of insulin for an emergency refill if the total
- 10 quantity dispensed does not exceed a 30-day supply. The [quantity
- 11 of an emergency refill of insulin-related equipment or supplies
- 12 may not exceed [$\frac{1}{2}$ the lesser of a 30-day supply or] the smallest
- 13 <u>commercially</u> available package <u>necessary for a 30-day supply</u>.
- SECTION 2. Section 565.003, Occupations Code, as amended by
- 15 Chapters 1105 (H.B. 2174) and 1166 (H.B. 3284), Acts of the 86th
- 16 Legislature, Regular Session, 2019, is reenacted to read as
- 17 follows:
- 18 Sec. 565.003. ADDITIONAL GROUNDS FOR DISCIPLINE REGARDING
- 19 APPLICANT FOR OR HOLDER OF NONRESIDENT PHARMACY LICENSE. Unless
- 20 compliance would violate the pharmacy or drug statutes or rules in
- 21 the state in which the pharmacy is located, the board may discipline
- 22 an applicant for or the holder of a nonresident pharmacy license if
- 23 the board finds that the applicant or license holder has failed to

- 12 Safety Code, or the Comprehensive Drug Abuse Prevention and Control

- 15 (5) developed an incapacity that prevents the
- 16 applicant or registrant from practicing as a pharmacy technician or

- 20 (A) Chapter 481 or 483, Health and Safety Code,

- 22 (B) Sections 485.031-485.034 [485.031-485.035],
- 23 Health and Safety Code; or
- (C) a rule adopted under Section 485.002

- 26 (7) violated the pharmacy or drug laws or rules of this
- 27 state, another state, or the United States;

- 1 (8) performed duties in a pharmacy that only a
- 2 pharmacist may perform, as defined by the rules of the board;
- 3 (9) used alcohol or drugs in an intemperate manner
- 4 that, in the board's opinion, could endanger a patient's life;
- 5 (10) engaged in negligent, unreasonable, or
- 6 inappropriate conduct when working in a pharmacy;
- 7 (11) violated a disciplinary order;
- 8 (12) been convicted or adjudicated of a criminal
- 9 offense that requires registration as a sex offender under Chapter
- 10 62, Code of Criminal Procedure; or
- 11 (13) been disciplined by a pharmacy or other health
- 12 regulatory board of this state or another state for conduct
- 13 substantially equivalent to conduct described by this subsection.
- 14 SECTION 4. To the extent of any conflict, this Act prevails
- 15 over another Act of the 88th Legislature, Regular Session, 2023,
- 16 relating to nonsubstantive additions to and corrections in enacted
- 17 codes.
- SECTION 5. Section 568.003(a), Occupations Code, as amended
- 19 by this Act, applies only to disciplinary action regarding conduct
- 20 that occurs on or after the effective date of this Act. Conduct
- 21 that occurs before the effective date of this Act is governed by the
- 22 law in effect on the date the conduct occurred, and the former law
- 23 is continued in effect for that purpose.
- SECTION 6. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
