4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 28, Education Code, is
6	amended by adding Section 28.0121 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 28.0121. ELECTIVE COURSE ON COMMUNITY SAFETY, FIREARM
8	SAFETY, AND MENTAL HEALTH. (a) A school district or
9	open-enrollment charter school may offer to students in grade 12 an
10	elective course on community safety, firearm safety, and mental
11	health that meets the requirements for an elective credit under
12	<u>Section 28.025.</u>
13	(b) A course under this section must include:
14	(1) during the first semester of the course,
15	instruction relating to:
16	(A) family violence prevention, including
17	relevant family violence statistics;
18	(B) sexual assault prevention, including
19	relevant sexual assault statistics;
20	(C) self-defense tactics; and
21	(D) mental health; and
22	(2) during the second semester of the course:
23	(A) instruction relating to firearm safety,
24	including relevant firearm statistics;

1	(B) information on state and federal laws
2	governing the use of firearms; and
3	(C) information contained in the classroom
4	instruction portion of the handgun proficiency course described by
5	Section 411.188, Government Code.
6	(c) A student may not enroll in the second semester of a
7	course under this section unless the student has satisfactorily
8	completed the first semester of the course.
9	(d) A school district or open-enrollment charter school may
10	allow a student to earn full course credit for a course under this
11	section if the student:
12	(1) satisfactorily completes the first semester of the
13	course;
14	(2) not later than the beginning of the second
15	semester of the course, meets the eligibility requirements for
16	obtaining a license to carry a handgun under Subchapter H, Chapter
17	411, Government Code; and
18	(3) instead of enrolling in the second semester of the
19	course, completes the handgun proficiency course described by
20	Section 411.188, Government Code.
21	SECTION 2. This Act applies beginning with the 2024-2025
22	school year.
23	SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
24	a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
25	provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
26	Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
27	Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
