6	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
7	SECTION 1. Section $54.366(a)$, Education Code, is amended to
8	read as follows:
9	(a) A student is exempt from the payment of tuition and fees

- S authorized in this chapter, including tuition and fees charged by 10 an institution of higher education for a dual credit course or other 11 12 course for which a high school student may earn joint high school and college credit, if the student: 13
- 14 (1) was under the conservatorship of the Department of Family and Protective Services: 15
- on the day preceding the student's 18th 16 (A) birthday;
- on or after the day of the student's 14th 18 (B) birthday, if the student was also eligible for adoption on or after 19
- 20 that day;

- 21 on the day the student graduated from high
- 22 school or received the equivalent of a high school diploma;
- 23 (D) on the day preceding:
- (i) the date the student is adopted[, if 24

1 that date is on or after September 1, 2009]; or

- 2 (ii) the date permanent managing
- 3 conservatorship of the student is awarded to a person other than the
- 4 student's parent[, if that date is on or after September 1, 2009];
- 5 or
- 6 (E) during an academic term in which the student
- 7 was enrolled in a dual credit course or other course for which a
- 8 high school student may earn joint high school and college credit;
- 9 and
- 10 (2) enrolls in an institution of higher education as
- 11 an undergraduate student or in a dual credit course or other course
- 12 for which a high school student may earn joint high school and
- 13 college credit not later than the student's 25th birthday.
- 14 SECTION 2. The changes in law made by this Act to Section
- 15 54.366, Education Code, apply beginning with tuition and fees
- 16 charged for the 2023 fall semester. Tuition and fees charged for a
- 17 term or semester before the 2023 fall semester are governed by the
- 18 law in effect immediately before the effective date of this Act, and
- 19 the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 20 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 21 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 22 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 23 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 24 Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
