## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT 2 relating to state preemption of and the effect of certain state or federal law on certain municipal and county regulation. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 5 SECTION 1. This Act shall be known as the Texas Regulatory Consistency Act. 6 7 SECTION 2. 7 as added by this Act, applies only to a cause of action that accrues 8 on or after the effective date of this Act.

9 SECTION 17. This Act takes effect immediately if it 10 receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each 11 house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. 12 If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate 13 effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
