## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

2	relating	to a	a study	on	veteran	deaths	caused	by	suicide.

- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. (a) In this section:
- 5 (1) "Commission" means the Texas Veterans Commission.
- 6 (2) "Veteran" has the meaning assigned by Section
- 7 2308.251, Government Code.

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- 8 (b) The commission shall conduct a study to evaluate veteran
- 9 deaths in this state caused by suicide in the preceding five years.
- 10 The report must include, if available:
- 11 (1) the total number of veterans whose death was
- 12 caused by suicide in the preceding five years;
- 13 (2) a summary of the age, gender, and race of each
- 14 veteran described by Subdivision (1) of this subsection;
- 15 (3) a comprehensive list of the medications prescribed
- 16 to or controlled substances present in the body of each veteran
- 17 described by Subdivision (1) of this subsection at the time of the
- 18 veteran's death, as applicable, including any medication that:
- 19 (A) was labeled with a warning box included in
- 20 the prescribing information due to the drug's serious or
- 21 life-threating side effects or risks;
- 22 (B) was taken for a purpose inconsistent with the
- 23 United States Food and Drug Administration's approved use of the
- 24 medication;

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- 1 (C) was a psychotropic; or
- 2 (D) was labeled with a warning regarding the risk
- 3 of developing suicidal ideation;
- 4 (4) a summary of medical diagnoses for veterans by
- 5 physicians employed by the United States Department of Veterans
- 6 Affairs that led to the physicians prescribing the medications
- 7 described by Subdivision (3) of this subsection;
- 8 (5) the number of instances during which a veteran
- 9 whose death was caused by suicide was on multiple medications
- 10 prescribed by a physician employed by the United States Department
- 11 of Veterans Affairs;
- 12 (6) the percentage of veterans described by
- 13 Subdivision (1) of this subsection who were not taking any
- 14 medication prescribed by a physician employed by the United States
- 15 Department of Veterans Affairs;
- 16 (7) the percentage of veterans described by
- 17 Subdivision (1) of this subsection with combat experience or who
- 18 experienced trauma, including military sexual trauma, traumatic
- 19 brain injury, and post-traumatic stress disorder;
- 20 (8) each Veterans Health Administration facility with
- 21 a notably high percentage of prescriptions per facility patient or
- 22 of suicide rates among patients treated at the facility;
- 23 (9) a description of United States Department of
- 24 Veterans Affairs policies governing the prescribing of medications
- 25 described by Subdivision (3) of this subsection;
- 26 (10) any patterns apparent to the commission based on
- 27 the review; and

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- 1 (11) recommendations for further action that would
- 2 improve the safety and well-being of veterans.
- 3 (c) The commission may collaborate with any state or federal
- 4 agency as necessary to obtain the information described by
- 5 Subsection (b) of this section.
- 6 (d) Not later than March 1, 2025, the commission shall
- 7 prepare and submit to the governor and legislature and post on the
- 8 commission's Internet website a report containing the results of
- 9 the study and any recommendations for legislative or other action.
- 10 SECTION 2. This Act expires September 1, 2025.
- 11 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
