A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to the notice given to certain victims of family violence,
- 3 stalking, harassment, or terroristic threat.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. This Act shall be known as the Natalia Cox Act.
- 6 SECTION 2. Subtitle E, Title 2, Human Resources Code, is
- 7 amended by adding Chapter 51A to read as follows:
- 8 CHAPTER 51A. NOTICE TO VICTIMS OF FAMILY VIOLENCE, STALKING,
- 9 HARASSMENT, OR TERRORISTIC THREAT
- 10 Sec. 51A.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:
- 11 (1) "Family" has the meaning assigned by Section
- 12 <u>71.003</u>, Family Code.
- 13 (2) "Family violence" has the meaning assigned by
- 14 Section 71.004, Family Code.
- 15 (3) "Harassment" means any conduct that constitutes an
- 16 offense under Section 42.07, Penal Code.
- 17 (4) "Household" has the meaning assigned by Section
- 18 <u>71.005</u>, Family Code.
- 19 <u>(5) "Member of a household" has the meaning assigned</u>
- 20 by Section 71.006, Family Code.
- 21 (6) "Stalking" means any conduct that constitutes an
- 22 offense under Section 42.072, Penal Code.
- 23 (7) "Terroristic threat" means any conduct that
- 24 constitutes an offense under Section 22.07, Penal Code.

- 1 Sec. 51A.002. APPLICABILITY TO VICTIMS OF CERTAIN OFFENSES.
- 2 This chapter applies to a victim of family violence, stalking,
- 3 harassment, or terroristic threat, including:
- 4 (1) an adult member of a family or household who is
- 5 subjected to an act of family violence;
- 6 (2) a member of the household of the adult described by
- 7 Subdivision (1), other than the member of the household who commits
- 8 the act of family violence; and
- 9 (3) a person who is subjected to conduct constituting
- 10 stalking, harassment, or terroristic threat.
- Sec. 51A.003. NOTICE TO VICTIMS. (a) The commission by rule

- 16 (b) The notice adopted under this section must include the

(c) The notice adopted under this section may include any 13 14 other information the commission considers useful to a victim of 15 family violence, stalking, harassment, or terroristic threat. 16 (d) The commission shall periodically update the notice 17 required under this section.

- 6 caused by family violence shall:
- 7 (1) immediately provide the person with information
- 8 regarding the nearest family violence shelter center;
- 9 (2) document in the person's medical file:
- 10 (A) the fact that the person has received the
- 11 information provided under Subdivision (1); and
- 12 (B) the reasons for the medical professional's
- 13 belief that the person's injuries were caused by family violence;
- 14 and
- 15 (3) give the person the [a] written notice adopted by
- 16 the Health and Human Services Commission under Section 51A.003,
- 17 <u>Human Resources Code</u> [in substantially the following form,
- 18 completed with the required information, in both English and
- 19 Spanish:
- 20 ["It is a crime for any person to cause you any physical injury or
- 21 harm even if that person is a member or former member of your family
- 22 or household].
- 23 ["NOTICE TO ADULT VICTIMS OF FAMILY VIOLENCE
- 24 ["You may report family violence to a law enforcement officer by
- 25 calling the following telephone numbers:
- 26 ______.
- 27 ["If you, your child, or any other household resident has been

- 1 injured or if you feel you are going to be in danger after a law
- 2 enforcement officer investigating family violence leaves your
- 3 residence or at a later time, you have the right to:
- 4 ["Ask the local prosecutor to file a criminal complaint
- 5 against the person committing family violence; and
- 6 ["Apply to a court for an order to protect you. You may want
- 7 to consult with a legal aid office, a prosecuting attorney, or a
- 8 private attorney. A court can enter an order that:
- 9 ["(1) prohibits the abuser from committing further
- 10 acts of violence;
- 11 ["(2) prohibits the abuser from threatening,
- 12 harassing, or contacting you at home;
- 13 ["(3) directs the abuser to leave your household; and
- 14 ["(4) establishes temporary custody of the children or
- 15 any property.
- 16 ["A VIOLATION OF CERTAIN PROVISIONS OF COURT-ORDERED PROTECTION MAY
- 17 BE A FELONY.
- 18 ["CALL THE FOLLOWING VIOLENCE SHELTERS OR SOCIAL ORGANIZATIONS IF
- 19 YOU NEED PROTECTION: ______."
- SECTION 7. Article 5.04(c), Code of Criminal Procedure, is
- 21 repealed.
- SECTION 8. Not later than December 1, 2023, the Health and
- 23 Human Services Commission shall adopt and make available the notice
- 24 required by Chapter 51A, Human Resources Code, as added by this Act.
- 25 SECTION 9. Article 2.1398, Code of Criminal Procedure, as
- 26 added by this Act, Article 5.04, Code of Criminal Procedure, as
- 27 amended by this Act, and Section 51.2825, Education Code, as added

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- 1 by this Act, apply only to a peace officer's or campus peace
- 2 officer's investigation or response that occurs on or after January
- 3 1, 2024. An investigation or response that occurs before January 1,
- 4 2024, is governed by the law in effect immediately before the
- 5 effective date of this Act, and the former law is continued in
- 6 effect for that purpose.
- 7 SECTION 10. Section 91.003, Family Code, as amended by this
- 8 Act, applies only to medical treatment provided on or after January
- 9 1, 2024. Medical treatment provided before January 1, 2024, is
- 10 governed by the law in effect immediately before the effective date
- 11 of this Act, and the former law is continued in effect for that
- 12 purpose.
- 13 SECTION 11. This Act takes effect immediately if it
- 14 receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each
- 15 house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution.
- 16 If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate
- 17 effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
