A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT

- 2 relating to the foundation curriculum and social studies curriculum
- 3 in public schools.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 28.002, Education Code, is amended by
- 6 amending Subsections (h-1), (h-2), and (h-6) and adding Subsection
- 7 (h-3) to read as follows:
- 8 (h-1) In adopting the essential knowledge and skills for the
- 9 foundation curriculum under Subsection (a)(1), the State Board of
- 10 Education shall, as appropriate, adopt essential knowledge and
- 11 skills that develop each student's civic knowledge, including an
- 12 understanding of:
- 13 (1) the fundamental moral, political, and
- 14 intellectual foundations of the American experiment in
- 15 self-government;
- 16 (2) political ideologies, such as communism and
- 17 totalitarianism, that conflict with the principles of freedom and
- 18 democracy essential to the founding principles of the United
- 19 States;
- 20 (3) the student's shared rights and responsibilities
- 21 as a resident of this state;
- 22 <u>(4)</u> the history, qualities, traditions, and features
- 23 of civic engagement in the United States;
- (5) $[\frac{3}{3}]$ the structure, function, and processes of

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- 1 government institutions at the federal, state, and local levels;
- 2 and
- 3 (6) $[\frac{(4)}{(4)}]$ the founding documents of the United States,
- 4 including:
- 5 (A) the entirety of the Declaration of
- 6 Independence;
- 7 (B) the entirety of the United States
- 8 Constitution;
- 9 (C) the Federalist Papers, including the
- 10 entirety of Essays 10 and 51;
- 11 (D) excerpts from Alexis de Tocqueville's
- 12 Democracy in America;
- 13 (E) the transcript of the first Lincoln-Douglas
- 14 debate;
- 15 (F) the writings of the founding fathers of the
- 16 United States;
- 17 (G) the entirety of Frederick Douglass's
- 18 speeches "The Meaning of July Fourth for the Negro" and "What the
- 19 Black Man Wants"; and
- 20 (H) the entirety of Martin Luther King Jr.'s
- 21 speech "I Have a Dream."
- 22 (h-2) In adopting the essential knowledge and skills for the
- 23 social studies curriculum for each grade level from kindergarten
- 24 through grade 12, the State Board of Education shall adopt
- 25 essential knowledge and skills that develop each student's civic
- 26 knowledge, including:
- 27 (1) an understanding of:

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- 1 (A) the fundamental moral, political,
- 2 entrepreneurial, and intellectual foundations of the American
- 3 experiment in self-government;
- 4 (B) the history, qualities, traditions, and
- 5 features of civic engagement in the United States;
- 6 (C) the civic-minded expectations of an upright
- 7 and desirable citizenry that recognizes and accepts responsibility
- 8 for preserving and defending the blessings of liberty inherited
- 9 from prior generations and secured by the United States
- 10 Constitution;
- 11 <u>(D)</u> the structure, function, and processes of
- 12 government institutions at the federal, state, and local levels;
- 13 and
- (E) [(D)] the founding documents of the United
- 15 States;
- 16 (2) the ability to:
- 17 (A) analyze and determine the reliability of
- 18 information sources;
- 19 (B) formulate and articulate reasoned positions;
- (C) understand the manner in which local, state,
- 21 and federal government works and operates through the use of
- 22 simulations and models of governmental and democratic processes;
- 23 (D) <u>advocate effectively before governing bodies</u>
- 24 and officials;
- 25 (E) actively listen and engage in civil
- 26 discourse, including discourse with those with different
- 27 viewpoints; and

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- 1 (F) $\left[\frac{E}{E}\right]$ participate as a citizen in a
- 2 constitutional democracy by voting; and
- 3 (3) an appreciation of:
- 4 (A) the importance and responsibility of
- 5 participating in civic life;
- 6 (B) a commitment to the United States and its
- 7 form of government; and
- 8 (C) a commitment to free speech and civil
- 9 discourse.
- 10 (h-3) The State Board of Education shall adopt oral history
- 11 resources to be used by school districts in instruction in the
- 12 essential knowledge and skills adopted under Subsections (h-1) and
- 13 (h-2) that provide portraits in patriotism based on the personal
- 14 stories of diverse <u>individuals</u> who <u>demonstrate civic-minded</u>
- 15 qualities, including first-person accounts of victims of other
- 16 <u>nations' governing philosophies who can compare those philosophies</u>
- 17 with the governing philosophies of the United States.
- 18 (h-6) In providing instruction regarding the founding
- 19 documents of the United States as described by Subsection (h-1)(6)
- $[\frac{(h-1)(4)}{2}]$, a school district or open-enrollment charter school
- 21 shall use those documents as part of the instructional materials
- 22 for the instruction.
- 23 SECTION 2. This Act applies beginning with the 2023-2024
- 24 school year.
- 25 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 26 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 27 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this

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- 1 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 2 Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
