 1-20 AN ACT

1-21 relating to an exemption from the plumbing licensing law for
 1-22 certain work performed on certain private property.

1-23 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

1-24 SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 1301, Occupations Code, is
 1-25 amended by adding Section 1301.059 to read as follows:

1-26 Sec. 1301.059. WORK PERFORMED ON CERTAIN PRIVATE PROPERTY.

1-27 (a) A person is not required to be licensed under this chapter to
 1-28 perform work consisting of installing, servicing, or repairing
 1-29 service mains or service lines that provide water, sewer, or storm
 1-30 drainage services on private property in an area that extends from a
 1-31 public right-of-way or public easement to not less than five feet
 1-32 from a building or structure.

1-33 (b) This section does not apply to plumbing work performed
 1-34 on private property designated for use as a one-family or
 1-35 two-family dwelling.

1-36 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
