2	relating to late applications for the appraisal of land for ad
3	valorem tax purposes as qualified open-space land following the
4	death of the owner of the land.
5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Section 23.541, Tax Code, is amended by adding
7	Subsection (a-1) and amending Subsection (b) to read as follows:
8	(a-1) Notwithstanding Subsection (a), the chief appraiser
9	shall accept and approve or deny an application for appraisal under
10	this subchapter after the deadline for filing the application has
11	passed if:
12	(1) the land that is the subject of the application was
13	appraised under this subchapter in the preceding tax year;
14	(2) the former owner of the land described by
15	Subdivision (1) died during the preceding tax year; and
16	(3) the application is filed not later than the
17	delinquency date for the taxes on the land for the year for which
18	the application is filed by:
19	(A) the surviving spouse or a surviving child of
20	the former owner;
21	(B) the executor or administrator of the estate
22	of the former owner; or
23	(C) the trustee of a trust created by the former
24	owner or the surviving spouse or a surviving child of the trustor of

- 1 such a trust who is acting as a beneficiary under the trust.
- 2 (b) If appraisal under this subchapter is approved when the
- 3 application is filed late, the owner is liable for a penalty of 10
- 4 percent of the difference between the amount of tax imposed on the
- 5 property and the amount that would be imposed if the property were
- 6 taxed at market value. The penalty prescribed by this subsection
- 7 does not apply to a late application filed under Subsection (a-1).
- 8 SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies
- 9 beginning with the 2023 tax year.
- 10 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 11 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 12 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 13 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 14 Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
