11	(1) the name of the owner;
12	(2) any available information about the firearm; and
13	(3) the date that the owner became aware the firearm
14	was lost or stolen.
15	(b) The department shall regularly send all reports
16	received under Subsection (a) to the National Crime Information
17	<u>Center.</u>
18	SECTION 2. Chapter 46, Penal Code, is amended by adding
19	Section 46.135 to read as follows:
20	Sec. 46.135. FAILURE TO REPORT LOST OR STOLEN FIREARM. (a)
21	A person commits an offense if the person:

(1) owns a firearm that is subsequently lost by or

- 1 report of the loss or theft to be made, to a peace officer or law
- 2 enforcement agency not later than 24 hours after the time the person
- 3 became aware the firearm was lost or stolen.
- 4 (b) An offense under this section is a Class C misdemeanor,
- 5 except that the offense is a Class B misdemeanor if it is shown on
- 6 the trial of the offense that the defendant has been previously
- 7 convicted of an offense under this section.
- 8 <u>(c) If conduct constituting an offense under this section</u>
- 9 also constitutes an offense under another section of this code, the
- 10 actor may be prosecuted under either section or under both
- 11 <u>sections.</u>
- 12 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
