5	SECTION 1. Section 1701.352(b), Occupations Code, is

7	(b) The commission shall require a state, county, special
8	district, or municipal agency that appoints or employs peace
9	officers to provide each peace officer with a training program at
10	least once every 48 months that is approved by the commission and
11	consists of:
12	(1) topics selected by the agency; and
13	(2) for an officer holding only a basic proficiency
14	certificate, not more than 20 hours of education and training that
15	contain curricula incorporating the learning objectives developed
16	by the commission regarding:
17	(A) civil rights, racial sensitivity, and
18	cultural diversity;
19	(B) de-escalation and crisis intervention
20	techniques to facilitate interaction with persons with mental
21	impairments, including training on identifying and interacting
22	with trauma-impacted veterans and training on diverting those
23	veterans to available community resources;

No. 2441 interaction with members of the public, including techniques for 1 limiting the use of force resulting in bodily injury; and 2 3 (D) unless determined by the agency head to be 4 inconsistent with the officer's assigned duties: 5 (i) the recognition, documentation, and 6 investigation of cases that involve child abuse or neglect, family violence, and sexual assault, including the use of best practices 7 8 and trauma-informed techniques to effectively recognize, document, and investigate those cases; and 9 10 (ii) issues concerning sex offender characteristics. 11 SECTION 2. As soon as practicable after the effective date 12 of this Act, the Texas Commission on Law Enforcement shall adopt 13 14 rules necessary to implement Section 1701.352(b), Occupations 15 Code, as amended by this Act.
