1	AN ACT
2	relating to the provision of accelerated and supplemental
3	instruction to public school students who fail to achieve
4	satisfactory performance on certain assessment instruments.
5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Section 28.0211, Education Code, is amended by
7	amending Subsections (a), (a-1), (a-2), (a-3), (a-4), (a-5), (c),
8	(f), (f-3), and (n) and adding Subsections (b) and (q) to read as
9	follows:
10	(a) <u>Using funds appropriated for the purposes of</u>
11	accelerated instruction, each time a student fails to [A school
12	district shall establish an accelerated learning committee
13	described by Subsection (c) for each student who does not] perform
14	satisfactorily on <u>an assessment instrument administered</u> [\div
15	(1) the third grade mathematics or reading assessment
16	<pre>instrument] under Section 39.023(a), the school district in which</pre>
17	the student attends school shall provide to the student accelerated
18	instruction in the applicable subject area [39.023;
19	(2) the fifth grade mathematics or reading assessment
20	instrument under Section 39.023; or
21	[(3) the eighth grade mathematics or reading
22	assessment instrument under Section 39.023].
23	(a-1) <u>In addition to accelerated instruction provided under</u>
24	Subsection (a) and subject to Subsection (b), each [Each] time a

- 1 student fails to perform satisfactorily on an assessment instrument
- 2 administered under Section 39.023(a) in mathematics or reading in
- 3 grades three through eight [the third, fourth, fifth, sixth,
- 4 seventh, or eighth grade], the school district in which the student
- 5 attends school shall [provide to the student accelerated
- 6 instruction in the applicable subject area during the subsequent
- 7 summer or school year and either]:
- 8 (1) allow the student to be assigned a classroom
- 9 teacher who is certified as a master, exemplary, or recognized
- 10 teacher under Section 21.3521 for the subsequent school year in the
- 11 applicable subject area; or
- 12 (2) provide the student supplemental instruction
- 13 under Subsection (a-4).
- 14 (a-2) Accelerated instruction provided under Subsection (a)
- 15 [during the following school year under Subsection (a-1)] may
- 16 require participation of the student before or after normal school
- 17 hours and may include participation at times of the year outside
- 18 normal school operations, including the summer following the school
- 19 year in which the student failed to perform satisfactorily on an
- 20 assessment instrument.
- 21 (a-3) In providing accelerated instruction to a student in
- 22 grades three through eight [under Subsection (a-1)], a district may
- 23 not remove the [a] student, except under circumstances for which a
- 24 student enrolled in the same grade level who is not receiving
- 25 accelerated instruction would be removed, from:
- 26 (1) instruction in the foundation curriculum and
- 27 enrichment curriculum adopted under Section 28.002 for the grade

- 1 level in which the student is enrolled; or
- 2 (2) recess or other physical activity that is
- 3 available to other students enrolled in the same grade level.
- 4 (a-4) Supplemental [If a district receives funding under
- 5 Section 29.0881, the Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental
- 6 Appropriations Act, 2021 (Div. M, Pub. L. No. 116-260), or the
- 7 American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (Pub. L. No. 117-2), then
- 8 supplemental instruction provided by a school district under
- 9 Subsection (a-1)(2) must:
- 10 (1) include targeted instruction in the essential
- 11 knowledge and skills for the applicable grade levels and subject
- 12 area;
- 13 (2) be provided in addition to instruction normally
- 14 provided to students in the grade level in which the student is
- 15 enrolled;
- 16 (3) [be provided for no less than 30 total hours during
- 17 the subsequent summer or school year and, unless the instruction is
- 18 provided fully during summer, include instruction no less than once
- 19 per week during the school year;
- $[\frac{(4)}{(4)}]$ be designed to assist the student in achieving
- 21 satisfactory performance in the applicable grade level and subject
- 22 area;
- (4) (4) include effective instructional materials
- 24 designed for supplemental instruction;
- 25 [(6) be provided to a student individually or in a
- 26 group of no more than three students, unless the parent or guardian
- 27 of each student in the group authorizes a larger group;

- 1 (5) [(7)] be provided by a person with training in the
- 2 applicable instructional materials for the supplemental
- 3 instruction and under the oversight of the school district; and
- 4 (6) $[\frac{(8)}{(8)}]$ to the extent possible, be provided by one
- 5 person for the entirety of the student's supplemental instruction
- 6 period.
- 7 (a-5) Each school district shall establish a process
- 8 allowing for the parent or guardian of a student who fails to
- 9 perform satisfactorily on the third, fifth, or eighth grade
- 10 mathematics or reading [an] assessment instrument administered
- 11 [specified] under Section 39.023(a) [Subsection (a)] to make a
- 12 request for district consideration that the student be assigned to
- 13 a particular classroom teacher in the applicable subject area for
- 14 the subsequent school year, if more than one classroom teacher is
- 15 available.
- 16 (b) During each state fiscal biennium, a school district is
- 17 only required to implement Subsection (a-1) if the legislature
- 18 appropriates sufficient money for the district to provide an
- 19 educator to tutor each student reasonably expected to require
- 20 supplemental instruction under Subsection (a-1). A school district
- 21 may use money appropriated for the purposes of supplemental
- 22 instruction to implement Subsection (a-1) in any manner that meets
- 23 the requirements of that subsection.
- (c) After a student fails to perform satisfactorily on the
- 25 third, fifth, or eighth grade mathematics or reading assessment
- 26 instrument administered under Section 39.023(a) and fails in the
- 27 subsequent school year to perform satisfactorily in the same

- 1 subject, the school district shall establish [on an assessment
- 2 instrument specified under Subsection (a), an accelerated
- 3 learning committee [shall be established]. The accelerated
- 4 learning committee shall be composed of the principal or the
- 5 principal's designee, the student's parent or guardian, and the
- 6 teacher of the subject of an assessment instrument on which the
- 7 student failed to perform satisfactorily. The district shall
- 8 notify the parent or guardian of the time and place for convening
- 9 the accelerated learning committee and the purpose of the
- 10 committee.
- 11 (f) <u>If an [An]</u> accelerated learning committee <u>is required</u>
- 12 [described] by Subsection (c), the committee shall, not later than
- 13 the start of the [subsequent] school year[τ] following the second
- 14 year in which the student does not perform satisfactorily on an
- 15 <u>assessment instrument described by Subsection (c):</u>
- 16 (1) identify the reason the student did not perform
- 17 satisfactorily;
- 18 (2) develop an educational plan for the student that
- 19 provides the necessary accelerated instruction to enable the
- 20 student to perform at the appropriate grade level by the conclusion
- 21 of the school year; and
- 22 (3) determine if additional resources are required for
- 23 that student to ensure that the student performs satisfactorily on
- 24 the next administration of the assessment instrument.
- 25 (f-3) The board of trustees of each school district shall
- 26 adopt a policy [consistent with the grievance procedure adopted
- 27 under Section 26.011] to allow the [a] parent of a student to

- 1 determine that $[contest\ the\ content\ or\ implementation\ of]$ an
- 2 educational plan developed under Subsection (f) may not be
- 3 <u>implemented for the student</u>.
- 4 (n) Except as provided by Subsection (n-1), a student who
- 5 fails to perform satisfactorily on an assessment instrument
- 6 specified under Subsection (a-5) [(a)] and is promoted to the next
- 7 grade level must be assigned in the subsequent school year in each
- 8 subject in which the student failed to perform satisfactorily on an
- 9 assessment instrument specified under Subsection (a-5) [(a)] to an
- 10 appropriately certified teacher who meets all state and federal
- 11 qualifications to teach that subject and grade.
- 12 (q) A school district's determination of the
- 13 appropriateness of accelerated or supplemental instruction for a
- 14 student under this section is final and does not create a cause of
- 15 <u>action.</u>
- SECTION 2. Section 28.0217(a), Education Code, is amended
- 17 to read as follows:
- 18 (a) Using money appropriated for the purposes of
- 19 accelerated instruction, each [Each] time a student fails to
- 20 perform satisfactorily on an assessment instrument administered
- 21 under Section 39.023(c), the school district in which the student
- 22 attends school shall provide to the student accelerated instruction
- 23 in the applicable subject area.
- SECTION 3. Sections 28.0211(f-4), (f-5), (o), and (p),
- 25 Education Code, are repealed.
- 26 SECTION 4. As soon as practicable after the effective date
- 27 of this Act, the board of trustees of a school district shall adopt

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- 1 a policy as required by Section 28.0211(f-3), Education Code, as
- 2 amended by this Act.
- 3 SECTION 5. This Act applies beginning with the 2023-2024
- 4 school year.
- 5 SECTION 6. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 6 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 7 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 8 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 9 Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
