- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. The heading to Subchapter A-1, Chapter 614, 6 Government Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 7 SUBCHAPTER A-1. PROVISIONS RELATING TO MENTAL HEALTH [LEAVE]
- 8 SECTION 2. Subchapter A-1, Chapter 614, Government Code, is
- 9 amended by adding Sections 614.014 and 614.016 to read as follows:
- 10 Sec. 614.014. DEFINITION. In this subchapter, "law
- 11 enforcement agency" means an agency of this state or an agency of a
- 12 political subdivision of this state authorized by law to employ
- 13 peace officers.

- 14 Sec. 614.016. TERMINATION FOR SEEKING MENTAL HEALTH CARE
- 15 PROHIBITED. A law enforcement agency may not terminate the
- 16 employment of a peace officer solely because the peace officer has
- 17 sought or received mental health care.
- 18 SECTION 3. Section 614.015(a), Government Code, is
- 19 repealed.
- SECTION 4. Section 614.016, Government Code, as added by
- 21 this Act, applies to mental health care regardless of whether the
- 22 care was sought or received by a peace officer before, on, or after
- 23 the effective date of this Act.
- SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
