A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the operation of and lighting equipment for medical examiner vehicles and vehicles operated by justices of the peace in 3 certain circumstances. 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 5 6 SECTION 1. Section 545.156, Transportation Code, is amended to read as follows: 7 Sec. 545.156. VEHICLE APPROACHED BY AUTHORIZED EMERGENCY 8 9 VEHICLE. (a) This section applies only to: (1) [On the immediate approach of] an authorized 10 emergency vehicle using audible and visual signals that meet the 11 12 requirements of Sections 547.305 and 547.702; 13 (2) a medical examiner vehicle, as defined by Section 14 547.751, lawfully using a visual signal in accordance with that 15 section; 16 (3) a vehicle operated by a justice of the peace for a purpose described by Section 547.752 and lawfully using a visual 17 signal in accordance with that section; and 18 (4) [, or of] a police vehicle lawfully using only an 19 20 audible or visual signal. 21 (a-1) On the immediate approach of a vehicle described by Subsection (a), an operator, unless otherwise directed by a police 22 23 officer, shall: 24 (1) yield the right-of-way;

No. 2616 1 (2) immediately drive to a position parallel to and as close as possible to the right-hand edge or curb of the roadway 2 3 clear of any intersection; and 4 (3) stop and remain standing until the authorized 5 emergency vehicle has passed. 6 (b) This section does not exempt the operator of \underline{a} [and authorized emergency] vehicle described by Subsection (a) from the 7 8 duty to drive with due regard for the safety of all persons using the highway. 9 SECTION 2. Chapter 547, Transportation Code, is amended by 10 adding Subchapter L-1 to read as follows: 11 SUBCHAPTER L-1. ADDITIONAL LIGHTING EQUIPMENT AUTHORIZED FOR 12 MEDICAL EXAMINER VEHICLES AND VEHICLES OPERATED BY JUSTICES OF THE 13 14 PEACE IN CERTAIN CIRCUMSTANCES 15 Sec. 547.751. ADDITIONAL LIGHTING EQUIPMENT AUTHORIZED FOR MEDICAL EXAMINER VEHICLES. (a) In this section, "medical examiner 16 17 vehicle" means a motor vehicle that is owned or leased by a governmental entity for use by a medical examiner or an employee of 18 an office of a medical examiner in the performance of the examiner's 19 or employee's duties relating to an inquest conducted under 20 Subchapter B, Chapter 49, Code of Criminal Procedure. 21 (b) A medical examiner vehicle may be equipped with either: 22 (1) mounted signal lamps that comply with the 23 24 requirements of Section 547.702(c); or 25 (2) a signal lamp that is temporarily attached to the 26 vehicle roof and flashes red and blue lights visible at a distance

27 of at least 500 feet in normal sunlight.

10	CIRCUMSTANCES. (a) A vehicle operated by a justice of the peace in
11	the course and scope of the justice's duties as a coroner under
12	Subchapter A, Chapter 49, Code of Criminal Procedure, may be
13	equipped with either:
14	(1) mounted signal lamps that comply with the
15	requirements of Section 547.702(c); or
16	(2) a signal lamp that is temporarily attached to the
17	vehicle roof and flashes red and blue lights visible at a distance
18	of at least 500 feet in normal sunlight.
19	(b) A justice of the peace may use the lighting equipment
20	described by Subsection (a) only when:
21	(1) necessary to warn other vehicle operators or
22	pedestrians of the approach of a vehicle operated by a justice of
23	the peace; and
24	(2) operating the vehicle in the course and scope of
25	the justice's duties relating to an inquest conducted under
26	Subchapter A, Chapter 49, Code of Criminal Procedure.
27	SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
