## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the duties of a law enforcement agency regarding 3 missing children and missing persons. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 SECTION 1. Article 63.009(a), Code of Criminal Procedure, 5 is amended to read as follows: 6 7 (a) A law enforcement agency, on receiving a report of a missing child or missing person, shall: 8 9 (1)if the subject of the report is a child and the child is at a high risk of harm or is otherwise in danger or if the 10 11 subject of the report is a person who is known by the agency to have 12 or is reported to have chronic dementia, including Alzheimer's dementia, whether caused by illness, brain defect, or brain injury, 13 14 immediately start an investigation in order to determine the present location of the child or person; 15 if the subject of the report is a child or person 16 (2) other than a child or person described by Subdivision (1), start an 17 investigation with due diligence in order to determine the present 18 location of the child or person; 19 immediately, but not later than two hours after 20 (3) 21 receiving the report, enter the name of the child or person into the clearinghouse and the national crime information center missing 22 23 person file if the child or person meets the center's criteria, and report that name to the Alzheimer's Association Safe Return 24

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1 emergency response center if applicable, with all available 2 identifying features such as dental records, fingerprints, other 3 physical characteristics, and a description of the clothing worn 4 when last seen, and all available information describing any person 5 reasonably believed to have taken or retained the missing child or 6 missing person;

not later than the 60th day after the date the 7 (4) 8 agency receives the report, enter the name of the child or person into the National Missing and Unidentified Persons System, with all 9 10 available identifying features such as dental records, fingerprints, other physical characteristics, and a description of 11 12 the clothing worn when last seen, and all available information describing any person reasonably believed to have taken or retained 13 14 the missing child or missing person; [and]

15 (5) <u>electronically submit to each municipal or county</u> 16 <u>law enforcement agency within 200 miles the report and any</u> 17 <u>information that may help determine the present location of the</u> 18 child or person within 48 hours; and

19 (6) inform the person who filed the report of the 20 missing child or missing person that the information will be:

(A) entered into the clearinghouse, the national
crime information center missing person file, and the National
Missing and Unidentified Persons System; [and]

(B) reported to the Alzheimer's Association Safe
Return emergency response center if applicable; and

26 (C) submitted to each municipal or county law 27 <u>enforcement agency within 200 miles</u>.

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1 SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies only 2 to a report of a missing child or missing person that is made to a 3 law enforcement agency on or after the effective date of this Act. 4 A report of a missing child or missing person that is made to a law 5 enforcement agency before the effective date of this Act is 6 governed by the law in effect on the date the report was made, and 7 the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.

8 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
