A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the composition of the Board of Pardons and Paroles. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: SECTION 1. Section 508.031, Government Code, is amended by 4 5 adding Subsections (a-1) and (c) and amending Subsection (b) to 6 read as follows: (a-1) The board must include at least: 7 (1) two members who have bachelor's degrees in 8 9 behavioral mental health, each of whom is: (A) a licensed clinical social worker, as defined 10 by Section 505.002, Occupations Code; 11 12 (B) a licensed professional counselor, as defined by Section 503.002, Occupations Code; or 13 14 (C) a psychologist, as defined by Section 501.002, Occupations Code; 15 (2) one member whose parent, sibling, child, or 16 grandparent has been incarcerated; and 17 18 (3) one but not more than three members who have bachelor's degrees in criminal justice or a related field and who 19 are former employees of a law enforcement agency. 20 21 (b) Appointments to the board must be made without regard to the [race, color,] disability, [sex,] religion, or age[, or 22 23 national origin] of the appointed members. 24 (c) The composition of the board must reflect the ethnic

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<u>diversity of the inmate population of the department</u>, and at least <u>half of the members of the board must be female</u>.

3 SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act does not 4 affect the entitlement of a member serving on the Board of Pardons 5 and Paroles immediately before the effective date of this Act to 6 continue to serve for the remainder of the member's term. As the 7 terms of members expire, the governor shall appoint or reappoint 8 members who have the qualifications required by Section 508.031, 9 Government Code, as amended by this Act.

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SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
