- 5 SECTION 1. Section 442.0053, Government Code, is amended to

- 7 Sec. 442.0053. ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA FOR INCLUSION OF REAL
- 8 PROPERTY IN STATE HISTORIC SITES SYSTEM. (a) The commission by
- 9 rule shall adopt criteria for determining the eligibility of real
- 10 property [donated to the commission] for inclusion in the historic
- 11 sites system.
- 12 (b) The commission may <u>acquire</u> by <u>purchase</u> or <u>gift</u> or <u>in</u> any
- 13 <u>other manner</u> [accept a donation of] real property that satisfies
- 14 the criteria adopted under Subsection (a).
- 15 <u>(b-1)</u> Before adding real property to the historic sites
- 16 system under this section, the commission shall develop a funding
- 17 plan for the restoration, interpretation, development, long-term
- 18 operation, and preservation of the real property to be added to the
- 19 historic sites system. The plan may provide for an endowment fund,
- 20 or other sources of funding, as appropriate. The commission may not
- 21 add the real property to the historic sites system unless there are
- 22 <u>adequate financial resources available or assured for the</u>
- 23 restoration, interpretation, development, long-term operation, and
- 24 preservation of the real property.

- 2 (1) renovate or restore [donated] real property
- 3 acquired under Subsection (b), including improvements to the

- 5 (2) construct new improvements on the [donated] real
- 6 property as necessary and prudent.

- 10 the greater of \$10 [\$6] million or two percent of the amount
- 11 appropriated for implementing the historic courthouse preservation
- 12 program during the state fiscal biennium.

- 8 OPERATIONS FUND. (a) The Texas Historical Commission retail
- 9 operations fund is a special fund established outside the state
- 10 treasury as a fund to be held and administered by the comptroller as
- 11 directed by the commission to provide support for commission retail
- 12 operations under Section 442.112. The fund consists of revenue
- 13 <u>from commission retail operations and may not include appropriated</u>
- 14 money.
- 15 (b) Interest and income from assets of the fund shall be
- 16 credited to and deposited in the fund.
- 17 (c) Money in the fund may be spent without appropriation and
- 18 be used only to benefit state historic sites and to support the
- 19 commission's retail operations, including to pay personnel
- 20 salaries, acquire capital improvements, contract for necessary
- 21 services, and purchase inventory, advertising, fixtures, computer
- 22 software, and other goods necessary to support the retail
- 23 <u>operations.</u>
- SECTION 7. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
