- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4
- SECTION 1. (a) In this section, "council" means the Texas 5
- Interagency Council for the Homeless established under Subchapter 6
- 7 KK, Chapter 2306, Government Code.
- (b) The council shall conduct a study to examine the housing 8
- 9 needs of youth transitioning from foster care or the juvenile
- 10 justice system to independent living.
- 11 In conducting the study under this section, the council
- 12 shall:

- homelessness 13 (1)examine the risk of for youth
- 14 transitioning out of foster care in this state;
- 15 (2) examine the risk of homelessness for
- 16 transitioning out of the juvenile justice system in this state;
- assess the unique housing needs of youth who: 17 (3)
- 18 have previously been classified as a dual (A)
- status child, as defined by Section 51.02, Family Code; and 19
- 20 (B) are part of a disproportionately represented
- 21 population in foster care, the juvenile justice system, or both;
- 22 evaluate relevant programs and practices of state
- 23 agencies that seek to positively impact the transition of youth out
- of foster care or the juvenile justice system; and 24

- 1 (5) consult with individuals with expertise on issues
- 2 faced by youth transitioning out of foster care, the juvenile
- 3 justice system, or both.
- 4 (d) Not later than November 1, 2024, the council shall
- 5 prepare and submit to the Texas Department of Housing and Community
- 6 Affairs and the legislature a written report that:
- 7 (1) summarizes the results of the study conducted
- 8 under this section; and
- 9 (2) includes legislative recommendations based on the
- 10 results of the study, including recommendations to improve the
- 11 transition of youth out of foster care and the juvenile justice
- 12 system.
- SECTION 2. This Act expires December 31, 2024.
- SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
