A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT

- 2 relating to information about available free or low-cost cellular
- 3 telephones and free or low-cost cellular telephone service plans
- 4 provided to residents of certain nursing and assisted living
- 5 facilities.
- 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 7 SECTION 1. Section 242.501(a), Health and Safety Code, is
- 8 amended to read as follows:
- 9 (a) The executive commissioner by rule shall adopt a
- 10 statement of the rights of a resident. The statement must be
- 11 consistent with Chapter 102, Human Resources Code, but shall
- 12 reflect the unique circumstances of a resident at an
- 13 institution. At a minimum, the statement of the rights of a
- 14 resident must address the resident's constitutional, civil, and
- 15 legal rights and the resident's right:
- 16 (1) to be free from abuse and exploitation;
- 17 (2) to safe, decent, and clean conditions;
- 18 (3) to be treated with courtesy, consideration, and
- 19 respect;
- 20 (4) to not be subjected to discrimination based on
- 21 age, race, religion, sex, nationality, or disability and to
- 22 practice the resident's own religious beliefs;
- 23 (5) to place in the resident's room an electronic
- 24 monitoring device that is owned and operated by the resident or

- 1 provided by the resident's guardian or legal representative;
- 2 (6) to privacy, including privacy during visits and
- 3 telephone calls;
- 4 (7) to complain about the institution and to organize
- 5 or participate in any program that presents residents' concerns to
- 6 the administrator of the institution;
- 7 (8) to have information about the resident in the
- 8 possession of the institution maintained as confidential;
- 9 (9) to retain the services of a physician the resident
- 10 chooses, at the resident's own expense or through a health care
- 11 plan, and to have a physician explain to the resident, in language
- 12 that the resident understands, the resident's complete medical
- 13 condition, the recommended treatment, and the expected results of
- 14 the treatment, including reasonably expected effects, side
- 15 effects, and risks associated with psychoactive medications;
- 16 (10) to participate in developing a plan of care, to
- 17 refuse treatment, and to refuse to participate in experimental
- 18 research;
- 19 (11) to a written statement or admission agreement
- 20 describing the services provided by the institution and the related
- 21 charges;
- 22 (12) to manage the resident's own finances or to
- 23 delegate that responsibility to another person;
- 24 (13) to access money and property that the resident
- 25 has deposited with the institution and to an accounting of the
- 26 resident's money and property that are deposited with the
- 27 institution and of all financial transactions made with or on

- 1 behalf of the resident;
- 2 (14) to keep and use personal property, secure from
- 3 theft or loss;
- 4 (15) to not be relocated within the institution,
- 5 except in accordance with standards adopted under Section 242.403;
- 6 (16) to receive visitors;
- 7 (17) to receive unopened mail and to receive
- 8 assistance in reading or writing correspondence;
- 9 (18) to participate in activities inside and outside
- 10 the institution;
- 11 (19) to wear the resident's own clothes;
- 12 (20) to discharge himself or herself from the
- 13 institution unless the resident is an adjudicated mental
- 14 incompetent;
- 15 (21) to not be discharged from the institution except
- 16 as provided in the standards adopted under Section 242.403;
- 17 (22) to be free from any physical or chemical
- 18 restraints imposed for the purposes of discipline or convenience,
- 19 and not required to treat the resident's medical symptoms; [and]
- 20 (23) to receive information about prescribed
- 21 psychoactive medication from the person prescribing the medication
- 22 or that person's designee, to have any psychoactive medications
- 23 prescribed and administered in a responsible manner, as mandated by
- 24 Section 242.505, and to refuse to consent to the prescription of
- 25 psychoactive medications; and
- 26 (24) to receive information, at the time of admission
- 27 and annually following admission, about available programs

- 1 providing free or low-cost cellular telephones and free or low-cost
- 2 cellular telephone service plans to qualifying residents.
- 3 SECTION 2. Section 247.064(b), Health and Safety Code, is
- 4 amended to read as follows:
- 5 (b) The residents' bill of rights must provide that each
- 6 resident in the assisted living facility has the right to:
- 7 (1) manage the resident's financial affairs;
- 8 (2) determine the resident's dress, hair style, or
- 9 other personal effects according to individual preference, except
- 10 that the resident has the responsibility to maintain personal
- 11 hygiene;
- 12 (3) retain and use personal property in the resident's
- 13 immediate living quarters and to have an individual locked cabinet
- 14 in which to keep personal property;
- 15 (4) receive and send unopened mail;
- 16 (5) unaccompanied access to a telephone at a
- 17 reasonable hour or in case of an emergency or personal crisis;
- 18 (6) privacy;
- 19 (7) unrestricted communication, including personal
- 20 visitation with any person of the resident's choice, at any
- 21 reasonable hour, including family members and representatives of
- 22 advocacy groups and community service organizations;
- 23 (8) make contacts with the community and to achieve
- 24 the highest level of independence, autonomy, and interaction with
- 25 the community of which the resident is capable;
- 26 (9) present grievances on behalf of the resident or
- 27 others to the operator, state agencies, or other persons without

- 1 threat of reprisal in any manner;
- 2 (10) a safe and decent living environment and
- 3 considerate and respectful care that recognizes the dignity and
- 4 individuality of the resident;
- 5 (11) refuse to perform services for the facility,
- 6 except as contracted for by the resident and operator;
- 7 (12) practice the religion of the resident's choice;
- 8 (13) leave the facility temporarily or permanently,
- 9 subject to contractual or financial obligations; [and]
- 10 <u>receive information</u>, at the time of admission and
- 11 annually following admission, about available programs providing
- 12 free or low-cost cellular telephones and free or low-cost cellular
- 13 telephone service plans to qualifying residents; and
- 14 (15) not be deprived of any constitutional, civil, or
- 15 legal right solely by reason of residence in an assisted living
- 16 facility.
- 17 SECTION 3. As soon as practicable after the effective date
- 18 of this Act, the executive commissioner of the Health and Human
- 19 Services Commission shall adopt the rules necessary to implement
- 20 the changes in law made by this Act.
- 21 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
