2 SECTION 5. Section 522.033(a), Transportation Code, is 3 amended to read as follows:

4 The department may issue an original or renewal (a) 5 commercial driver's license or commercial learner's permit to a person whose driver's license or personal identification 6 certificate record indicates that the person is subject to the 7 8 registration requirements of Chapter 62, Code of Criminal Procedure, only if the person is otherwise eligible for the 9 commercial driver's license or commercial learner's permit and: 10

(1) applies in person for the issuance of <u>an initial</u>
[a] license or permit under this section; and

(A) \$20 for a commercial driver's license; or

SECTION 6. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to 16 personal 17 driver's license, identification certificate, а commercial driver's license, or commercial learner's permit issued 18 or renewed on or after the effective date of this Act. A driver's 19 license, personal identification certificate, commercial driver's 20 21 license, or commercial learner's permit issued or renewed before the effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect when 22 the license, certificate, or permit was issued or renewed, and the 23 24 former law is continued in effect for that purpose.

SECTION 7. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
