1 AN ACT relating to continuing education and training requirements for 2 3 classroom teachers and public school counselors. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 SECTION 1. Section 21.054(d), Education Code, as amended by 5 Chapters 1045 (S.B. 1267) and 973 (S.B. 2066), Acts of the 87th 6 Legislature, Regular Session, 2021, is reenacted and amended to 7 read as follows: 8 Subject to Subsection (d-2), continuing [Continuing] 9 (d) education requirements for a classroom teacher may not require 10 11 [must provide] that [not] more than 25 percent of the training 12 required every five years include instruction regarding: 13 (1) collecting and analyzing information that will 14 improve effectiveness in the classroom; 15 recognizing early warning indicators (2) that а student may be at risk of dropping out of school; 16 (3) digital learning, digital teaching, 17 and integrating technology into classroom instruction; 18 19 (4) educating diverse student populations, including: 20 (A) students who educationally are 21 disadvantaged; and 22 students at risk of dropping out of school; (B) 23 and 24 (5) understanding appropriate relationships,

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1 boundaries, and communications between educators and students.

2 SECTION 2. Section 21.054, Education Code, is amended by 3 adding Subsection (d-2) and amending Subsection (f) to read as 4 follows:

5 <u>(d-2)</u> Training in a topic of instruction described by 6 <u>Subsection (d) attended by a classroom teacher in excess of an</u> 7 <u>amount of hours equal to 25 percent of the training required of the</u> 8 <u>teacher every five years shall be counted toward the teacher's</u> 9 <u>overall training requirements.</u>

10 (f) Continuing education requirements for a counselor must 11 provide that <u>at least</u> [not more than] 25 percent of training 12 required every five years include instruction regarding:

13 (1) assisting students in developing high school14 graduation plans;

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(2) implementing dropout prevention strategies;

(3) informing students concerning:

17 (A) college admissions, including college18 financial aid resources and application procedures; and

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(B) career opportunities;

(4) counseling students concerning mental health
conditions and substance abuse, including through the use of
grief-informed and trauma-informed interventions and crisis
management and suicide prevention strategies; and

(5) effective implementation of a comprehensiveschool counseling program under Section 33.005.

26 SECTION 3. This Act applies beginning with the 2023-2024 27 school year.

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1 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 2 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 3 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 4 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 5 Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
