5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 32, Human Resources Code,
7	is amended by adding Section 32.02472 to read as follows:
8	Sec. 32.02472. PARENTAL CONSENT AND ACCESS TO INFORMATION
9	CONCERNING CERTAIN ADOPTED CHILDREN. The commission shall
10	collaborate with the Department of Family and Protective Services
11	to ensure that, if applicable, both adoptive parents of a child
12	adopted from the conservatorship of the department and eligible for
13	<pre>Medicaid are able to:</pre>
14	(1) consent to the medical care provided to the child
15	under Medicaid; and
16	(2) provide and receive information regarding the
17	child's Medicaid benefits, including:
18	(A) providing and receiving information through
19	any electronic interface or system used by the commission to
20	communicate to or about Medicaid recipients; and
21	(B) providing information to and receiving
22	<pre>information from:</pre>
23	(i) the commission;
24	(ii) the Medicaid managed care organization

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- 1 arranging for or providing the managed care plan in which the child
- 2 <u>is enrolled; and</u>
- 3 <u>(iii)</u> any health care provider providing
- 4 services to the child under Medicaid.
- 5 SECTION 2. If before implementing any provision of this Act
- 6 a state agency determines that a waiver or authorization from a
- 7 federal agency is necessary for implementation of that provision,
- 8 the agency affected by the provision shall request the waiver or
- 9 authorization and may delay implementing that provision until the
- 10 waiver or authorization is granted.
- 11 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
