- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 37.011(f), Education Code, is amended to 6 read as follows:
- 7 (f) A juvenile justice alternative education program must
- 8 provide [operate] at least 43,200 minutes of instructional time
- 9 [seven hours per day and 180 days] per year, except that a program
- 10 may apply to the Texas Juvenile Justice Department for a waiver of
- 11 the $\underline{\text{instructional time}}$ [$\frac{180-\text{day}}{\text{day}}$] requirement. The department may
- 12 not grant a waiver to a program under this subsection for a number
- 13 of <u>minutes</u> [days] that exceeds the highest number of instructional
- 14 minutes [days] waived by the commissioner during the same school
- 15 year for any [a] school district served by the program.
- SECTION 2. This Act applies beginning with the 2023-2024
- 17 school year.
- SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 19 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 20 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 21 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 22 Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
