- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 7.02(b), Penal Code, is amended to read
- 6 as follows:
- 7 (b) If, in the attempt to carry out a conspiracy to commit
- 8 one felony, another felony is committed by one of the conspirators,
- 9 all conspirators are guilty of the felony actually committed,
- 10 though having no intent to commit it, if the offense was committed
- 11 in furtherance of the unlawful purpose and was one that should have
- 12 been anticipated as a result of the carrying out of the conspiracy.
- 13 In this subsection, "conspiracy" means an agreement between two or
- 14 more persons to commit a felony.
- 15 SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies only
- 16 to an offense committed on or after the effective date of this Act.
- 17 An offense committed before the effective date of this Act is
- 18 governed by the law in effect on the date the offense was committed,
- 19 and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose. For
- 20 purposes of this section, an offense was committed before the
- 21 effective date of this Act if any element of the offense occurred
- 22 before that date.
- 23 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
