3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Section 601.002, Business & Commerce Code, is
5	amended to read as follows:
6	Sec. 601.002. APPLICABILITY OF CHAPTER; EXCEPTION. (a)
7	This chapter applies only to a consumer transaction in which:
8	(1) the merchant or the merchant's agent engages in a
9	personal solicitation of a sale to the consumer at a place other
10	than the merchant's place of business without the consumer's prior
11	<pre>invitation or request;</pre>

- 12 (2) the consumer's agreement or offer to purchase is
- 13 given to the merchant or the merchant's agent at a place other than
- 14 the merchant's place of business $\underline{\text{without the consumer's prior}}$
- 15 invitation or request; and
- 16 (3) the agreement or offer is for:
- 17 (A) the purchase of goods or services for
- 18 consideration that exceeds \$25, payable in installments or in cash;
- 19 or
- 20 (B) the purchase of real property for
- 21 consideration that exceeds \$100, payable in installments or in
- 22 cash.
- 23 (b) Notwithstanding Subsection (a), this chapter does not
- 24 apply to:

- 1 (1) a purchase of farm equipment;
- 2 (2) an insurance sale regulated by the Texas
- 3 Department of Insurance;
- 4 (3) a sale of goods or services made:
- 5 (A) under a preexisting revolving charge account
- 6 or retail charge agreement; [or]
- 7 (B) after negotiations between the parties at a
- 8 business establishment in a fixed location where goods or services
- 9 are offered or exhibited for sale; or
- (C) entirely by mail, Internet, or telephone and
- 11 without any other contact between the buyer and the seller or the
- 12 <u>seller's representative before delivery of the goods or performance</u>
- 13 <u>of the services; or</u>
- 14 (4) a sale of real property if:
- 15 (A) the purchaser is represented by a licensed
- 16 attorney;
- 17 (B) the transaction is negotiated by a licensed
- 18 real estate broker; or
- 19 (C) the transaction is negotiated at a place
- 20 other than the consumer's residence by the person who owns the
- 21 property.
- 22 SECTION 2. Section 601.101, Business & Commerce Code, is
- 23 amended to read as follows:
- Sec. 601.101. MERCHANT'S COMPENSATION. A merchant is not
- 25 entitled to compensation for services performed under a consumer
- 26 transaction canceled under this chapter unless the merchant in good
- 27 faith substantially began to perform the services at the consumer's

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- 1 request before the consumer gave notice of cancellation.
- 2 SECTION 3. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to
- 3 a consumer transaction that occurs on or after the effective date of
- 4 this Act. A consumer transaction that occurs before the effective
- 5 date of this Act is governed by the law in effect on the date the
- 6 transaction occurred, and the former law is continued in effect for
- 7 that purpose.
- 8 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
