16	under Article 39.14(h), Code of Criminal Procedure;
17	(3) the defendant is actually innocent of the offense
18	with which the defendant is charged; and
19	(4) the conduct described by Subdivision (2) was a
20	substantial contributing factor to the wrongful conviction of the
21	<pre>defendant.</pre>
22	(c) A person commits an offense if the person:
23	(1) is a prosecuting attorney; and

- 3 (d) An offense under this section is a felony of the second

- 5 (e) If conduct constituting an offense under this section
- 6 also constitutes an offense under another section of this code, the
- 7 actor may be prosecuted under either section or under both
- 8 <u>sections.</u>
